Dear People,

We know that the parishes of Our Lady's, Sacred Heart and St Joseph's are to become one area parish as part of the re-organsing of the diocese. Other parts of the diocese already have new areas, now we must plan.

We know that the number of mass-going Catholics is falling, as is the number of priests. There will be fewer churches and fewer celebrations of mass. In the next five years we expect the number of priests in the diocese to fall from 85 to 60 and to keep falling. The bishop must make appointments to share that smaller number. There are few young priests.

In our three local parishes are five churches and nine celebrations of mass each Saturday/Sunday. Two priests will soon be looking after those churches. How will they do it? Ask that question around the diocese and see the problem - though it is small compared with most parts of the Catholic world.

The Church as we have known it is dying or changing and we must adapt and change or simply fade away. We should be a mission Church but have allowed ourselves to become a maintenance one - just keeping going. Rather like driving down a dead-end road instead of finding an alternative route. What driver would do that? "I've always gone that way!" What bishop can allow a "No change here" attitude?

We need each others' suggestions to accept, refuse or consider. We shall begin our inter-parish meetings in the autumn. No grumbles, please.

The universal Church is changing radically. We can be glad of its loss of power in so-called Catholic countries such as Ireland, Spain, Portugal. The Church's involvement in European politics over the centuries on account of the Great Lie "The Donation of Constantine" (google and see for yourself) is a disturbing one. The rule of the popes in Rome was cruel and dictatorial and we can be glad it came to an end. Our mission is to bring the Gospel not to play power politics. The loss of influence may be God's plan for the Church to become more spiritual and less political? We pray for God's blessing and guidance.

Dear People,

Jesus forgave with God's love. It is one of many beautiful features of the Gospel. That forgiveness is always ours when we are sincerely sorry, just as it is with us and each other: no game playing, genuine sorrow and loving forgivenenss.

The Church formalised divine forgiveness as a form of community prayer and it is part of our celebration of mass. The Church organises services of forgiveness where the people gather together in prayer and repentance, but also has created the opportunity for people to make confession quietly to a priest.

That going to confession has never been popular. In the parish where I grew up there were confessions Saturday midday and evening and after Benediction on Wednesday and Friday evenings - with 4 priests hearing confessions. Those apparently high numbers, perhaps 150 per week, and many of them regular, represented 5% of the parish. 95% never went. The "good old days"? 95%. Now, less than 1% go, so more than 99% never do. The difference between 99% and 95% is not much. Both are a total failure in terms of number - but not for the people who still like to go regularly, like Pope Francis. In a recent article Ladislas Orsy wrote of the dying tradition of going to confession in "Thinking outside the Box" and he outlined the way he believed the sacrament would be best celebrated. outline was what we do here at St Joseph's in Advent and Lent, a way which I was given by a senior priest in another part of the country.
