Suddenly, those moments come. They seem perfect and you feel blessed. Some of the reasons you can see, others are out of sight or touch but you know they are part of it. I can't repeat. What has been and is can prepare for the newness of what will be – with its fulfilments, surprises, sorrows, new memories, happiness. The next 70 cannot be happier (I think!) than the previous 80, and I hope I am good enough to carry that happiness: I trust God will bless me to accept whatever comes. I am overwhelmed by these past 80 and can only look forward to the next 70. Then heaven. Couldn't ask for more. Heaven, and the whole wonderful pattern will become clear.

Selfish, so selfish and self-centred. Pretending to be happy when the world is sorrowing in war, hatreds, hunger, racial and religious tensions, cancer, ebola, poverty, broken lives and homes, cruelty and injustice.

I know, and I agree. I don't understand why I should have felt so happy when I am aware of so much suffering – but I was overwhelmed with a feeling of happiness. I don't deny the suffering but neither can I deny truth. A moment of great happiness. It was a gift. I didn't look for it, it came and I am grateful: but I am still fully aware of the suffering of our world. I wish I could share my happiness there.

Dear Funeral Firm

Years ago, I took a funeral service and told the family there would be no charges. I had done the same for other families.

A little while later the family told me they were disappointed that I had charged. I hadn't, I told them – but the charge was there on the bill they showed me.

I challenged you and there was an apology for an administrative error. I wondered how many other such "errors" had occurred when I had charged no fee and the families had been billed but had not liked to talk to me about it.

It has just happened again. I have never recommended you since that original incident, though I have never spoken to anyone against you.

These days I have to ask a church fee for everyone, but I never ask for a minister's fee.

I would like to believe this is another honest mistake, but twice bitten is making me feel shy.

Funerals are a very sad time for people and ministers but a necessary and fair business time for funeral firms. We can all make mistakes, I know, but we must learn from them. Yours sincerely, Fr John Daley

PS I wrote this letter this week - but have not yet sent it. I don't want someone to get into trouble but I do want a funeral firm to face up to its responsibilities. What do I do?

Loneliness

How many people die of loneliness? Last year in the UK over 50,000 people contacted the BBC in response to their programmes on loneliness. Old people, adolescents, primary school children told of the pain they felt every day. Everyone knows the pain of loneliness, it seems to be part of the human condition: the ache of being alone even though we may be at a party or with friends or at a concert.

"I am surrounded by the love of family and friends," a woman wrote after the death of her husband, "so how can I feel so alone? Why do I have this small but solid core of loneliness that sits inside me? It seems to expand and seep in every core of my mind and body."
