Dear People,

Would you vote for Welsh independence if I asked you nicely? What terms would you offer? We didn't ask to be in the United Kingdom, we were forced to be. Time has passed but does that alter the truth that we were conquered and forced to submit? Justice asks the English to listen to the voices of the conquered Welsh.

Same in the Holy Land. Justice demands the conqueror listens to the defeated and the displaced, whether we return to AD1948 or 13th century BC. The same question obtains: when do the rights of the conquered peoples cease to exist?

Northern and Southern Ireland, North Korea and South Korea, Kashmir, the Crimea, Tibet, etc. pose similar and other questions. The native peoples of North and South America have had little voice against their conquerors, enslaved peoples of the world have had limited justice in the freedoms finally granted by their conquerors and masters and empire builders, and the freedoms and conditions in former colonies is a shame in our world history.

Who will put it right? Is force the only convincing argument? Power blocs use their force and we ask if we are glad to be part of the most powerful bloc with our terrifying number of nuclear weapons. They will never be used, we are reassured, but they are a deterrent against those who would attack us. If we were attacked, then, we would have to be prepared to see our final act in life to be a revenge which would kill many millions of innocent people.

If Scotland gains its independence, strongly possible in the next ten years, we are told they would reject Trident and its deployment from their naval bases (the Scottish bishops have spoken against Trident and its implications). England would have to choose a new base. We wonder if it would choose a Welsh port, creating wonderful employment opportunities for Welsh people and immigrant workers.

Whose world do we live in - universal, nationalist, local, power-divided, divinely shaped? God bless America, we often hear, (and all who sail with her), and China and Russia and Iran and Saudi Arabia and all who sail with them.



Climate Change : From your Armchair Carole writes that we are living in strange times. The weather is quite biblical and we have seen countries on fire and others under water.

We are seeing extremes that need strong measures and governments seem reluctant to act. So what can we do as individuals?

(1) Change your energy supplier to a clean, green renewable supplier such as *Good Energy, Octopus, Green Tarrif* and *Bulb.* They are actually cheaper than the big suppliers.

All you need is an email address (the younger relatives could help set this up) and the energy compnay does everything once the form is emailed to them.

Remember switching to clean, green energy is the best thing we can do that can halt the damage that fossil fuels are doing to our environment.

(2) Use energy efficient electric heating, such as Fischer or Wibo.

(3) Have solar panels fitted to your home.

(4) Join groups like Greenpeace or Friends of the Earth.

(5) Write to your MP about climate change. (6) Re-use, recycle, save water, limit plastic.
