On the one side are Christians whose faith is based on cultural affiliations; the other are conservative hardliners who don't accept the current course of the Church because they feel it in contradiction with the Church of their dreams."

"His passion is for a radical Christian life, rooted in the Gospel and in the spirit of Vatican II.
