Dear People,

Thank you for your comments on last week's homily - the classroom discussion on how people like Hitler should/could be punished. I wanted you to sense how good in their thinking a class of 15/16-year-olds might be in talking about forgiveness, punishment, atonement.

The scene they arrived at, Hitler's coming before God at the completion of his life, understanding God's loving mercy and understanding the beautiful forgiveness that all those who had suffered because of him had already given him because they (now) shared God's loving forgiveness, you found a powerful image. Could it have happened like that?

You loved the rabbis' prayer "Dear God, we forgive our tormentors, those who hate us. And because we have forgiven them you have nothing against them." You found that wonderful: something divine within human forgiveness, even though the rabbis had seen and suffered so much.

If forgiveness like this could be offered in a concentration camp then it certainly could be offered in the love shared with God in eternal life.

Some of you admitted you had never thought in the way those girls and boys thought and spoke. Perhaps you would if you gave yourself the opportunity?

We have begun the week of Christian Unity, 18th-25th January each year. Do you have anything against those ole Proddy Dogs? Those were the words a good Catholic lady used about Christian Unity Week: "I don't want to pray with those ole P...s" Why was she so biaised? Would she blame others for her bias - "It was the way we were brought up," "It was the way we were taught" - the lamest excuses any adult can make. You are grown up now, they should be told. They can't use the excuse of when they were young. Our prejudices are ours, no matter how we learned them: up to us to rid ourselves of them.

We shall have to love our fellow Christians in heaven. Why not start now, making a little bit of heaven on earth?

A little girls said "If the Churches have been quarrelling all these years they should be ashamed of themselves." We are, shamefully. Christian Unity Week is here. We pray, separately or together . . .
