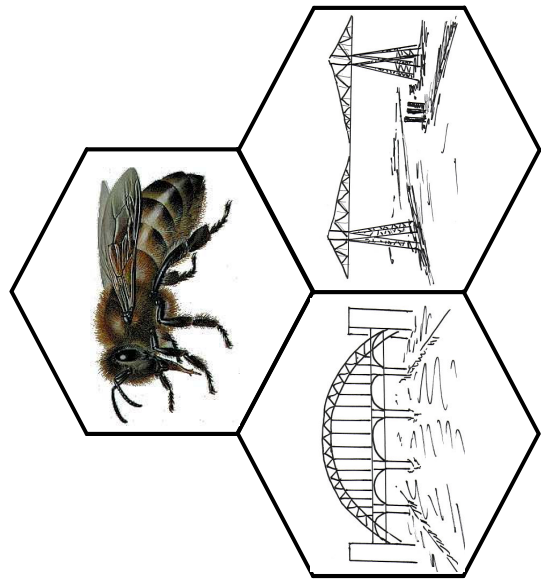

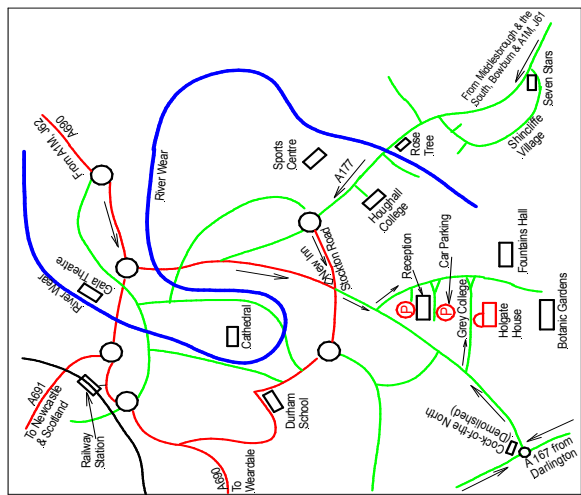

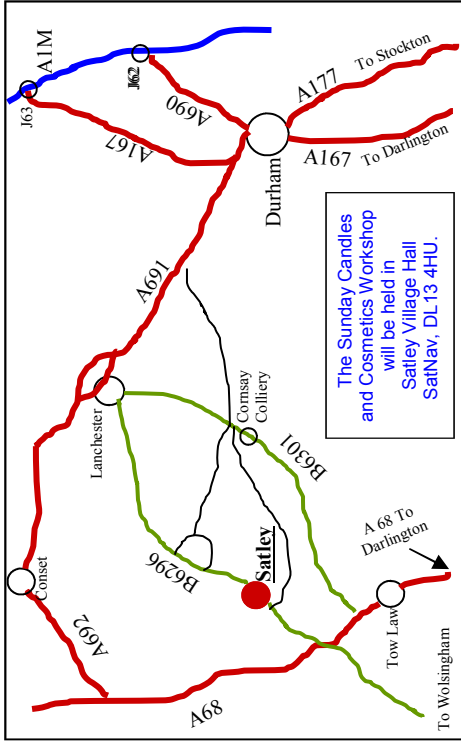

Directions to Grey College.
To get here, By Car: SatNav, DH1 3LG
From the North (A1M)
Exit at Junction 62, A690 to Durham. You will travel down a dual carriageway for 1.5 miles. At the roundabout, go straight ahead towards the City Centre. You will go down a hill. Stay in the left hand lane and just before the next roundabout, take the left filter lane. The Marriott Royal County Hotel is on your left. Go straight ahead at the traffic lights. Move into the right hand lane and filter slightly right up the hill. You will come to a cross roads with traffic lights. The New Inn is on your left. Go straight through the traffic lights and up the hill. Grey College is the second left turn. Car parking is both in front of and following the road to the left, behind the reception block.
From the South (A1M)
Exit at Junction 61, A177 to Bowburn and Durham. Stay on the A177 for about 5 miles and crossing the River Wear travel to the next island. Turn left and in 1/2 mile turn left at traffic lights, the New Inn is on your right... Grey College is the second left turn. Car parking is both in front of and following the road to the left, behind the reception block.
Meet in Holgate House.



Directions to Satley Village Hall.
By Car from the north:
Exit A1M at Junction 62, A690 to Durham. You will travel down a dual carriageway for 1.5 miles. Follow the signs for the A691 to Conset. Turn left for Lancheater and Satley.
From the south:
Via the A68, is signed for Satley just north of Tow Law. Turn right on the B6296 for Satley.
From the south:
Via the A167 & 177; head into Durham and take the A691 for Conset. Turn left for Lancheater and Satley.

They have always sought to engage speakers of international as well as national stature and this year is certainly no exception. Following the positive response received regarding the change of venue we have decided to meet again this year at Grey College, in Durham.

The University of Durham Botanic Garden is situated near Grey College and as guests of the College, you are welcome to wander there as you please. The nearby Oriental Museum is also well worth a visit, as are numerous places of interest within the City of Durham, in particular the Cathedral and the Castle.

OUR SPEAKERS

Philip McCabe

Philip is a third generation beekeeper and past President of the Federation of Irish Beekeepers' Associations. He shot to international fame in 2005 when, as President of Apimondia 2005 and dressed only in underpants he attempted to break the Guinness Record for "a mantle of bees", but "only 210,000 adhered to his body due to inclement weather conditions". He is well known in Ireland as a broadcaster on the radio programme "Mooney Goes Wild", while strawberry growers appreciate his invention of a specialised tunnel pollination system. He is based at the Adult College at An Grianan, Termonfechin, Eire and lectures nationally and internationally. He holds a third level qualification in Apicultural Science and currently works 60 colonies.

Dr. Geraldine Wright

Jeri Wright grew up and attended university in Wyoming, launching a scientific career in botany and entomology. In 1994 she moved on a prestigious scholarship to the Zoology Department at the University of Oxford, gaining a D Phil in insect foraging behaviour and nutritional homeostasis. She then spent six years back in the States, at the Rothenbuhler Honeybee Laboratory at Ohio State University, where she developed mathematical models of neural circuit function in relation to olfactory learning and memory in honeybees. In the Spring of 2005 she took up her present post as Lecturer in the Division of Biology at Newcastle University, with a research programme directed at the integration of information on smell and taste in the honeybee brain.

Mrs. Liz O'Neil

Liz writes: I became interested in candle making about 9 or 10 years ago when my husband began to keep bees. I learnt the basics of this art by attending a course at Chain Bridge Honey Farm and then began making various candles at home. This led to a decision to make and sell candles at craft fairs in the region, where I offered rolled and moulded candles in a variety of shapes and sizes, plus accessories. Later I learnt how to make moisturising cream and furniture polish, both of which proved popular. I have passed on some of this knowledge in talks and demonstrations to W.I.'s and Townswomen's Guilds and look forward to sharing my techniques and ideas with beekeepers at the Convention workshop.

Bring and Buy Sale

There will be a sale of attendees' beekeeping equipment and books on beekeeping, with proceeds being returned to the seller who can make a donation to conference funds if they wish. Sellers will be responsible for removal of unsold items.

Tricks of the Trade

This is the half hour when members of the audience can present an idea or invention they have found makes beekeeping easier for them. The maximum time of presentation per speaker is 5 minutes and suggestions for contributions should be made to the Convention Secretary, Stuart Johnson, preferably at the time of booking.

Honey Jar Label Competition

This year, for the first time, we will be holding a competition for the most attractive honey jar label designed by a participant. The designs must conform to BBKA rules and be affixed to empty standard 1lb honey jars. The winner will be chosen by ballot.

1. The label must display the word "Honey".
2. The weight must be indicated as "454g 1lb" in lettering at least 4mm high.
3. The country of origin of the honey must be indicated (e.g. "Produce of England", or "Harvested in Scotland").
4. The name and a contact address of the producer must be on the label.
5. The label must have a 'best before date' (5 years ahead of the bottling date is recommended, e.g. "BB end 2012").
6. If the honey is to be sold through a third party there must be a lot number to identify that batch (e.g. L8, or L 07/5, for the fifth lot extracted in 2007).
The flower type and the area where the honey was gathered may be specified in words or by illustration.

Candles and Cosmetics Workshop

The workshop this year will be held in Satley Village Hall beside St Cuthbert's Church, Satley, situated between Consett and Lanchester. A soup and sandwich lunch, tea and coffee will be provided free, but there will be a small additional charge for materials.

Workshop participants will need an **apron**, a **sharp knife**, a **12" ruler** (metal if possible), a **large plastic table mat or cutting board** for rolling candles, and **four small containers with lids**, for cream and polish preparations.

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
