MARGARET MURDIN “How To Be A Proficient Beekeeper.”

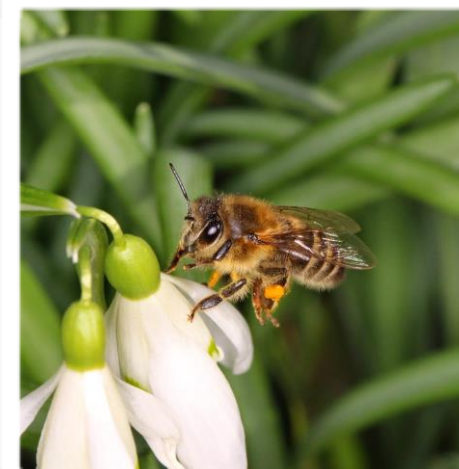
