CTS LENT COURSE 'FEAST OR FAMINE?'

This is five week Lent course that considers the practical issues of economic austerity vs plenty in modern Britain & beyond. How can we understand the inequalities of today in light of core Gospel themes, and how can Christians respond?

FUNDRAISING OPPORTUNITY

A local and vocal member of our Church said once that opportunity to eat together would be a good thing, for all sorts of reasons. This stuck in my mind even though it was during the Lent course about 5 years ago!

So how's about this for a suggestion? Form a Dining Group called 'SIX FOR DINNER' (for want of a better title). One person buys, cooks and presents a meal to five guests. Next time, one of the guests hosts the event, and so on. So how does this raise funds? Well we all like to eat out, but the cost can be very high. So if we all (six) pay a modest £25 (for a spread that might cost £45 commercially) and the cost is only £10 then there's a contribution of £15 to Church funds; that's £90 per table of six. And if 2 people host the event (in the same location) that's £180 for 2 tables and £270 if three people host it!

That's fundraising!!

So, who's kidding who, where do we get a spread for £10? Have a look at this costing, all based on ALDI prices today:

Chicken casserole Prawn cocktail	£1.83 £0.97	Nibbles A brandy	£0.23 £0.47
Wine (half bottle)	£3.50	A pudding	£0.47
Gin&Tonic	£0.82	Total	£9.27

Of course there are problems and difficulties: Our house isn't big enough for 6 let alone 12 or more people. So perhaps we use the Hall. I'm not smart enough to cook. OK so team up with someone who is. We haven't got enough furniture. Perhaps we can use the Hall furniture. I don't want a brandy. There's some who will enjoy two. I don't want all that food/drink. We'll make portions smaller. I don't like prawns. Tough! etc etc.

But these are to be overcome in the greater interest of having a jolly good night out in pleasant company. Any one up for this or a similar bash. The menu is only a suggestion. Liz thinks it's such a good idea, I can run the first one and she won't be late! Ray Smith
