WARNING!

Telephone Privacy Services

One of our members contacted the Scheme in July to tell us about a 'scam' telephone call they had received from a company called 'Telephone Privacy lady addressed Sevices'. The member by her name, confirmed her and that her telephone provider was BT. She went on to explain that, to stop nuisance calls, company, who worked with all the major telephone providers, could provide her with a small box, free of charge, which would filter out and stop all unwanted calls. Once the free box had been sent out there would be a small charge of £2 per month, for the company to 'filter' the calls, this would be payable in advance for a fixed term of 3 years, a total fee of £72.

Luckily our member did not succumb to her persuasion and ended the call. Having access to the internet she was then able to check the company on-line and saw warnings from West Mercier Police asking anyone contacted by the company to notify them, which she duly did.

No-one can argue the nuisance calls are extremely annoying and sometimes upsetting and I know that if there was a way of stopping such calls I, for one, would welcome such a service, however this is another example of how 'canny' some disreputable companies can be. We would like to remember everyone not to be taken in and provide anyone your bank details or any other personal details, however convincing they may seem!



INFORMATION FROM WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE AND TRADING STANDARDS SERVICE

West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Trading Standards Service are asking residents to be on their guard and to not let strangers into their homes. This time of year sees a sharp increase of complaints about cold callers offering roofing, gardening, driveways etc. Examples of recent distraction burglaries in the Leeds area are:

- Men offering to clean the drive—asking for headache tablets and to use the toilet
- Men wanting to do work on the roof—again asking for headache tablets
- Man selling tea towels on the doorstep, walked into house and took large some of money.

West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Trading Standards Service are working closely together to combat this type of crime. Often, criminals involved in distraction burglaries are also involved in other doorstep crime/rogue trading: Cold calling elderly consumers, persuading them to have work carried out such as roofing, gardening, driveway maintenance that is usually not required, not needed and in most cases vastly overcharged. Once at the property these criminals will use various excuses to get into the property. Often, one will keep the householder talking whilst another member of the gang will try to get entry to the property and steal personal belongings such as money and jewellery.

- Always keep your doors locked
- Do not keep large quantities of cash in the house
- Do not do business with doorstep callers
- Do not be afraid to say 'no' if someone asks to use your toilet or tries another means to get into your house.
- Always ask callers for their ID. They can pass this to you through the letterbox. Do
 not open your door to anyone that you are unsure of and do not let them in your
 home.
- Verify any I.D. Given to you independently, e.g. If a caller says they are from the
 water company or need to read your meter. Use your phone directory to contact
 the business the caller is claiming to be from to confirm they are who they say they
 are.
- If you have a door chain please use it before opening your door.
- Please be on the guard for elderly neighbours who may be taken in by such traders.
- Consumers have a 7 day cooling off period when agreeing to work at their own homes.
- If you are suspicious in any way then please do not hesitate to contact the Police or West Yorkshire Trading Standards Service.
- If you do see suspicious vehicles then please try to make a note of the registration number and description of the vehicle.
