SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - 06 MAY 2018

THEME

'God Does Not Have Favourites': In the first reading today Saint Peter reminds us that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who respects God and does what is right, is acceptable to Him. We consciously and unconsciously choose to have favourite people in our lives and, in many respects, we find it very difficult to love everyone equally. Human passions and desires for intimate love always brings with it different categories of friendship. However, for the Christian person, the critical factor is not to have jealously or resentment towards other people who love the same persons as we do; that our love is not selfish or possessive, or only on our own terms. Jesus in the Gospel today says 'You are my friends if you do what I command you; this is my commandment, love one another as I have loved you.' Jesus never seeks to exclude others from His love. But we make it harder for ourselves to be loved by God if we show little or no love for others. I admire those who show great love when they themselves have not been loved by others. So many of the sins of the world are caused by those who have themselves experienced the absence of love. Let me remind you again what Jesus said, 'what I command you is to love one another.'

Pope Francis is encouraging us through prayer to remember the unity of the family life in keeping with the Missionary Church. One of the most powerful ways to build up the family is to pray together as a family. Commencing this Monday 07 May, we will pray the Sorrowful Mysteries; on week commencing Monday 14 May, the Glorious Mysteries, and on week commencing Monday 21 May, we will pray the Mysteries of Light, as we remember the sacrifices and suffering endured by Christ out of love for us. <u>Ascension Thursday 10 May:</u> This Holy Day of Obligation marks the moment when after 40 days appearing to his apostles and disciples, Jesus ascended to

the Father and promised to send the Holy Spirit upon them all to bring about the birth of the Church on earth to bring forth the continued presence of Jesus most beautifully in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Masses that day are as indicated in the newsletter. Please do all you can to fulfil the Catholic tradition of attending Mass on a Holy Day of Obligation.

<u>Parish Pilgrimage to Gozo:</u> The pilgrims will depart from Edinburgh airport at 7.30 am on Sunday 13 May and will take with them the prayers and good wishes of the peoples of the parishes to Fr Tabone and Daniel, student priest. We are very grateful for all those who have made this pilgrimage possible including our friends in Gozo. We remember with posthumous love Joan Coghill who was due to join us, but who has sadly died. Also, Creena Doherty, who cannot attend due to receiving medical treatment. The pilgrims return on Thursday 17 May.

<u>Safeguarding in the Catholic Church in Scotland</u>: The Catholic Church in Scotland, in all parishes and dioceses, follows a set of policies and procedures which are detailed in a document signed by each Bishop on 18 March 2018. This document, titled 'In God's Image', instructs all those responsible for Safeguarding - clergy, religious, employees and volunteers - to follow the arrangements and to comply with the Safeguarding standards which are set out in detail. These include:

- 1. Creating safe Church environments to protect children and vulnerable adults and to prevent harm or abuse
- 2. Requiring compulsory PVG membership for all clergy, employees and volunteers who work with vulnerable groups
- 3. Encouraging the public to report suspicions of abuse or harm

- <u>4.</u> Mandatory reporting of all allegations of abuse (recent or historic) involving Church personnel to the Police
- <u>5.</u> Providing support, care and advice for survivors of abuse when they disclose their experience
- <u>6.</u> Requiring every parish to appoint a safeguarding co-ordinator to support parish volunteers.

Fr Jeremy would like to meet with the Safeguarding Co-ordinators from both parishes to make sure we are fully compliant with all the new regulations. A Safeguarding meeting is to be held on Monday 21 May at 7.00 pm in Broxburn parish house.
