Yes, it's 10 years since we opened the New Hall here in Ilton. (It actually opened on 15th December 2006 but as that's quite a busy time of year we thought we'd celebrate slightly earlier!) Join us at the Village Hall for a Bangers and Mash supper with a delicious pudding and then take a nostalgic look back at how the village hall began its life as a 'left over' from the RAF Station based here at Ilton in 1945.

Due to further cuts by the Conservatives at Somerset County Council to rural services the Mobile Library service has yet again been severely cut,

These cuts mean that the Spurwells and Wyndham Arms stops have been cut

St Peters Refurbishment

As most of you know, we believe that there should be a Church in the village so to make this a viable reality we realised that a small refurbishment would be necessary. In order to complete this, first of all we needed to apply for a 'faculty' which is the equivalent to planning permission and we are VERY pleased to announce that, just over 5 years later, we finally have it!!!

The whole project will cost £80,000 and this will give us a level, accessible Church with heating, water, toilet and small servery. The altar area will essentially be the Church, although for larger services, we would obviously use the whole Church, and the nave would become a useable space that we could hire out and so make it sustainable. So now, it's down to careful planning, good use of the meagre funds we do have and, of course, applying for those very much needed grants. When you apply for a grant you have to meet 2 criteria – the first is to match fund as much as possible towards the grants you are applying for, whether it's physically with money or by using free labour, free materials etc to help achieve the end goal. (Eg: if there is any kind soul out there that could build a couple of kitchen units – it's a very small servery! – then that would count as part of our contribution towards the project.) The second criteria is that we need to prove that this village is behind us and does want a Church to stay as an integral part of our lives and to this end we are asking all of you to fill in a questionnaire at the back of this newsletter.

Now this brings us on to 2 favours we'd like to ask;

- 1) We realise we have rather a lot of requests and it would take 3 or 4 visits to cover all of them so to save us time and you repeatedly answering the door, we'd like to call just the once! When we call we would like to enquire about the following; a) the questionnaire, b) if you would like a candle, c) if you would like to attend the harvest supper or the history evening, d) if you can donate anything towards our harvest raffle and e) if you are part of an organisation/charity that would like to have a Christmas Tree in the Church in December. We also realise that you are not going to support all of these, and we are not expecting you to, and indeed some of you may not want to support any, but if there is anything that you can do <u>please</u> fill in the questionnaire. The rest is completely voluntary and we won't be offended if you don't want anything else, a simple 'no thank you' is all we ask.
- 2) To cover the whole village takes an awful long time and we aim to do this by the end of September. If you could help us to cover an area, or even 2 or 3 houses next to you, we would be very grateful, every bit of help counts. Phone Kate (55308) or Jacqueline (54164) if you can help and we'll co-ordinate it so that we only call once! (You can also bring your completed questionnaires to our event at the Church on Bank Holiday Monday, if you prefer.)
