The following is intended as a guide to try and help.

The Parish Council has responsibility for some of the grass cutting around the village including the Recreation Ground, Church yard, Cemetery, Village Green. Also the recreation ground itself and Brook Common. Any issues with these areas can be reported to the Parish Clerk Sue Morley on 53378.

Fly Tipping

Fly tipping is on the increase around Ilton with rubbish being illegally dumped in areas such as Brook Common, The old railway halt and Frost lane among others.

People are being warned by South Somerset District Council to check out exactly where their waste is going if they pay a handyperson or company to take it away, or potentially face a fine of up to £5,000.

If you do employ someone to take your waste away you must make sure that they have a 'waste carrier's number'. You can call on the Environment Agency on 08708 506506 or visit their website.

Potentially if you don't check that they are authorised and they then dump your waste illegally, you could be found liable to a fine or a criminal record under fly tipping legislation.

Flytippers could be liable to a fine of up to £50,000, imprisonment and a criminal record. If caught

St Peters Church News

As most of you know we are at the beginning of a small refurbishment project in St Peters and the first stage has now been completed with the help of a grant. The next phase is to bring water and heating into the building which we hope will be complete by August this year. The aim of the whole project is to keep our Church in the village but, as we all know, numbers are declining and, that, coupled with the fact that hotels etc are now the more preferred options to get married in, crematoriums are now taking funeral/memorial services it is proving quite challenging. Also, people move around more and probably, 60% of the village now were neither born here or have lived here for a significant number of years making our particular Church of no big significance to them. However, it is still a lovely building to pray and worship in, is full of history, listed and of architectural interest, and we think it would be a great shame if we just let it fall into disrepair or be sold off for use as a private house.

We realise that, as it is, our Church is not sustainable as is the case of many Churches today, and that is why we are pressing ahead with the project – if we want to keep our Church then something has to happen, it simply will not survive as it is. (More and more Churches are having to find ways to stay sustainable, eg: Taunton church now has a cafe and book shop in it, Wells and Salisbury Cathedrals have restaurants and shops in them and many Churches/ Cathedrals charge an entrance fee.)

Therefore, we are keeping the most sacred part of the Church (the Sanctuary) as THE Church, although we will obviously use all of the building if necessary, including for weddings and funerals/memorial services. The remaining part of the Church will be used to sustain the building – we have many ideas such as private hire, a small café and library, concerts, art exhibitions etc. So, although it seems to be taking forever to complete we hope you will stay on the ride with us and enjoy the completed project at the end!! (Remember the hall project started in 1993 and took until 2006 to complete and at the beginning we were told it wouldn't be worth it and people wouldn't use it etc etc but today it stands as a success story and I'm sure it will be the same with the Church. Also isn't it better to say that we have these facilities in our village rather than have nothing, which is what would happen if people didn't try - look how we miss the shop!!)
