THE BISHOP'S LETTER

Comfortable Words

Do you remember the *Prayer Book Communion Service*, published in 1662, but still in use (often at 8am on Sundays) in some of our parishes? After the confession and absolution, the priest says these wonderful words:

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all that truly turn to him.

This is followed by four Bible verses, reinforcing the fact that we are forgiven people:

- *Come unto me all that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you.*
- *So God loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.*
- *Hear also what Saint Paul saith. This is a true saying, and worthy of all men to be received, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.*
- *Hear also what Saint John saith. If any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the propitiation for our sins.*

Sadly, we have lost this from some modern services, apart from *God so loved the world*, which is there as an option. The *Prayer Book* offers a deeper confession (not to everyone's taste these days), and in these verses a deeper assurance of forgiveness (albeit uncomfortable to some, especially in the verse from St John). The newer services bring in some good emphases, such as the way we feed on

Christ together, not in isolation from each other, having shared peace with one another. However, in our world today we could do with a return to a more thoroughgoing understanding of our sin, and then the fullness of our redemption by Christ. That is where true peace and joy are to be found.

Let's go back to that deeper prayer of confession (very precious to me as it formed a huge part of my coming to faith). Be prepared to be hit hard as you pray this prayer:

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, maker of all things, judge of all men: we acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time most grievously have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against thy divine majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us; the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honour and glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Now go back to the Comfortable Words, and let them reassure you of full forgiveness.

Your PCCs are working hard with the Archdeacon to resolve these difficulties, so please be patient. Your churchwardens (see p. 15) will be able to give you further updates.

We had two very successful Open Garden events during the month. On May 26th, thanks by and large to the very pleasant weather, the village was swamped with visitors from late morning in support of the NGS charity. Queues formed outside the Village Hall for lunches and teas (we had to send out for emergency cake!) and we raised an amazing £920. To this amount the "Gardeners" very generously donated a further £780 towards the Roof Repair Fund from their plant sales. Thank you to all those who worked so tirelessly on the day.

And on June 16th in a joint venture with the Village Hall we had another good turnout despite the weather. Once again a very special thank you to all those who helped in so many ways, especially those gardeners who so kindly opened their amazing gardens.

CONCERT

On Friday 14th June the church was full for "A Baroque Journey" presented by Judit Felszeghy and her Hungarian baroque group Ensemble Marquise. A programme of vocal and instrumental music in period costume took us from Hungary across Europe. This was a very different and unusual event for us but was very well received, especially the Hungarian food and wine. Many thanks to Judit, and especially Andrew (Banks), for their hard work and attention to detail, in particular for the use of Andrew's harpsichord.

ROOF REPAIR

As a result of the overwhelming generosity of villagers and others we have reached our goal to replace the church chancel roof. Listed building consent has been received from Daventry District Council, and tenders are in place. Once we have

authority from the DAC (Peterborough Diocesan Advisory Committee) we can proceed with the repair. As with all projects of this magnitude there will inevitably be additional costs, e.g. installing an appropriate alarm system. Once this has been achieved we hope to proceed with the replacement of our antiquated heating system.

We have decided to reintroduce our regular monthly clear-ups. If you can spare a couple of hours on Saturday 27th July at 10.00am you will be most welcome, - there is much to do. Refreshments will be available.

A BIG THANK YOU

RIDE AND STRIDE EVENT


14 September


