THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

Throughout Advent I was preaching about various different rules of life, or spiritual disciplines. The church has a rich history of people grappling with how to live their daily lives in the service and worship of their risen Lord. Having just celebrated the birth of the Son of God, and as we are celebrating a New Year may I suggest that you think of a renewal in your spiritual lives as well. Whether you believe in an external power, a divine God or in the wonder of the working of the universe it is always a good idea to reflect on our place within it all, keep our sense of perspective and see our lives in the context of a greater wonder of the world and existence. I love the Galaxy Song from Monty Python

*Just remember that you're standing on a planet that's evolving
 And revolving at nine hundred miles an hour
 That's orbiting at nineteen miles a second, so it's reckoned
 A sun that is the source of all our power*

Now I'm not suggesting that we all suddenly have a spiritual desire to live as monks or nuns (although who knows!) giving ourselves over to contemplation day and night. What I am suggesting though is that we set aside a moment or

two each day to consider things beyond the everyday routine, and I believe this will help us see more clearly the everyday routine.

I expect many of us have calendars on our walls at home, with significant events, birthdays, Dr.'s appointments etc. marked on it.

As a Christmas/New Year present to anyone that would like one I have put together a calendar to remind ourselves

to reflect and give thanks, especially in a Christian traditional way. Each month are the same couple of questions to ask ourselves each day (maybe you could write the answers on the calendar itself), pictures

to reflect on and a verse from the Psalms. On the cover are some suggestions for simple spiritual exercise to try out each day.

Many people find a little structure in their prayer life is a great help, but others are more spontaneous. As we saw looking through the Franciscan, Jesuit, Carmelite and Benedictine way of life there are many ways to organize your life in devotion, prayer and action


This month's meeting takes place on 26th January when Yvonne Bell will be talking about silk painting and church vestments. Why not come along and give us a try?
