THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

So, Easter is upon us. Winter has had its last few icy blasts, just to remind us that we live on an unpredictable planet. We are reminded that there is so much we still don't know about it, so much still to learn. We joke about weather forecasts, but we should be reminded that weather spans not just where we live but continents and oceans, vast expanses that hold powers and forces that we have no control over but can only observe and respond to. Many will be on school holidays and so weather forecasts, at least for the next day or so, become important. Will it be a day to be able to go out, or will you need to prepare for indoor activities?

CHRIST IS RISEN How much more so are unpredictable human reactions. Our motivations, our responses, our thought processes. So much human anxiety is created by our wish to understand other people. Not of itself a bad thing, but in many respects if you want full understanding it is ultimately futile. I am not sure that as a Christian we are actually called to understand our neighbour but we are called to love them. I often wonder why we feel the need to analyse each other. Often it is because someone else is having an effect in your life so I guess we wish to change their behaviour in some way to make our lives easier.

I get many very manipulative things said to me. One that has stuck in my mind was "I am trying very hard to like you" in other words, you need to change, not be yourself, then I can deal with you. My internal response was, actually I don't think I want you to like me, and if I tried to turn myself into what everybody else thinks I should be I would get completely messed up, after all no two people have the same ideas. As Christians we actually have a God that totally understands human frailty and psyche. Let's look at the drama of Easter. God became human in the person of Jesus, and gathered around him friends and disciples. There are numerous examples of the disciples advising Jesus to send people away, to dismiss people; but Jesus bears with them and just meets people where they are. People are transformed by his inspiration, but he does not demand people change before he meets them. Then we have Judas, and there are all sorts of theories about him. But one central one is that

> Jesus was not living up to his expectations. Judas might have expected Jesus to be more revolutionary, calling up an army to overthrow the Romans. Judas betrayed his firend. Ultimately this led to Jesus' Death and Resurrection which has led to our freedom.

> Jesus understands complex human relationship. Jesus can accompany us in our stumbling through relationships. There is only on person we can change and that is ourselves. We can change

and that is ourselves. We can change how we respond but not how others do. We can control how we react but not how others do. We love one another by letting them be themselves whether we like it or not. We are called to love and sometimes that means we are not liked. We are not called to be liked or indeed to be loved. It is all from us not towards us. Love your neighbour and let your neighbour be. Jesus bears all things for us.

Easter, Jesus, death and resurrection, frees us from having to be acceptable in other people's eyes. God loves us and sends us out to love others. Not to analyse them, not to manipulate them, not to turn them into something acceptable to us, just to love them.
