## LETTER FROM THE ARCHDEACON

### Knightley Benefice

Although we are training more curates in this diocese than ever before, we do not have enough to cover the number of clergy retirements.

A glance at the List of Rectors in most ancient parish churches reveals a long list of clergy often dating back to the 12th or 13th Century. Some would have been well loved and others ... not so much. Over the years churches have all sorts of clergy – the good, the bad and the ugly (to quote a well-known western), but their purpose does not change.

The amount of parish share received by the diocese in 2018 was underpaid by over £900,000. This means that the diocese is no longer able to carry parishes that are not paying parish share. Some of that underpayment came from the Knightley Benefice.

Amongst other things, the Rector is there to: mark the seasons of the year, from the expectation of Advent at the beginning of December through to the solemnity of Remembrance Sunday the following November; preside at the wonder of baptism, the joy of marriage and the sadness of funerals; visit the sick and house bound (whether at home or in hospitals or hospices); be thoroughly involved in the life of the local schools; be a reassuring presence in nursing homes and care homes; be a trusted and well known person in the parishes; ensure that the church family is an open and inclusive place where everyone is welcome; lead worship through each week – teaching, preaching and presiding; care for the homeless and those who are on the fringes of society; pray for parishioners and with parishioners and lead them into the very presence of God.

The Knightley Benefice is currently without a Rector. As Archdeacon, I have had conversations with the churches to see whether it is possible to appoint a full time incumbent or whether the churches can better afford a part time Rector. This discussion continues and various possible solutions are on the table – including the temporary use of some money held in reserve. However, at the end of the day all five parishes need to agree on the best way forward and then we will endeavour to appoint the right incumbent to live in the Rectory. Please be assured that we are doing everything possible to move matters forward.

Until then, it is good to remember that just as God has been faithful in the past, so we can trust him for the future.

It's a role that is surrounded by daily opportunities for the creative parson but there are some challenges:

### CHORAL EVENSONG

The reintroduction of Prayer Book Choral Evensongs into some of the beautiful churches around the south of Northamptonshire is attracting an enthusiastic following. The Fiori Musicali Choir are specialists in



the music of the Tudor period and more often than not, the music filling the church is from the Tudor

period. Elizabethan composers Byrd and Tallis feature large, but the Fiori Musicali Choir also strays into later centuries, offering music by Jacobean and Restoration composers too, with occasional forays into later repertoire.

Fiori Musicali bring to life for today the wonderfully noble language of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer.

Update with regards to Traffic Calming:

Steve Barber, Safety Office Northamptonshire Highways attended a meeting on 4 June 2019. Whilst a detailed report is awaited from NCC, a list of structures throughout the village were identified, where approval would be granted, to fix a speed indicator device (“SID”) as part of the Section 50 Licence which was required to operate an SID.

An initial review on site of the data collected by 2 SID’s placed by NCC revealed some interesting reading. Badby Road (on the Green which was not the most effective spot and we had requested the SID to be closer towards Bradbury Road) 85% of the vehicles travelling towards the school from Bradbury Road were logged at 31 mph, with 85% travelling down from the school towards the Green logged at 34 mph. Preston Capes Road, which logged 85% of vehicles at 40 mph, in both directions. The speed limit on both roads is 30 mph.

As you can see from the facts and figures, it is very important to the Parish Council that steps are taken to encourage safe driving on our roads.

We are working hard on other projects and are making steady progress. A new and comprehensive Website will be under construction shortly. It is hoped that this will be smart, informative and easy to use.

We do not meet during August. Our next meeting will take place on Monday 2nd September in the Village Hall at 19.30.
