- reminder of his rash stupidity, the crew blame the Mariner and hang the albatross around his neck

"Instead of the cross, the Albatross About my neck was hung."


It's a strange poem which may owe some of its quirkiness to Coleridge's opium habit! But before you return to Fleetwood Mac

Coleridge offers us some memorable and vivid lessons in this poem. Here's one of them – sometimes we carry our mistakes around our neck as a permanent reminder. Our future can be shaped by the failures of our past. The burden of our sin (as the *Book of Common Prayer* states so succinctly) is "intolerable".

What does the Bible have to say about this?

"For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear

him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." (Psalm 103:11,12)

WEATHER REPORT 2018

Well, didn't we have a good summer? Or at least a warm dry one - perhaps not quite so good if you are a farmer or grower.

Many thanks to Edgar Mobbs in Newnham, June Pound in Charwelton, and a recorder in Preston Capes for once again submitting their records and observations. As usual Newnham was considerably wetter (733mm) than Preston (563mm) with Charwelton in between at 686mm.

The long dry summer started in early June and carried on with no rain at all until 27 July and then only 16mm until 11th. August. As a result 2018 was one of the driest years in the 25 years of June and Edgar's records. They both recorded only 3 years with less rainfall, namely 2011, 2016 and, the driest of all, 2005 (517mm). Edgar has done some sums showing that on his records average annual rainfall over 5 year periods is remarkably consistent at about 750mm per year. The wettest year during those 25 years was 2012 with 1136mm, and indeed only one other year, 1998, topped 1000mm.

The wettest month during the year was March in all 3 villages (114mm C, 123mm N & 93mm PC) while the driest was June in C (7mm) & N (2mm) but November in PC with 21mm.

Despite the long hot summer average daytime maximum temperature was slightly lower than the 25 year mean at 12.17°, and similarly with the mean minimum night temps - 5.93° compared with 6.00°. The hottest day was 26 July (29° Charwelton and 32.2° Preston) while the coldest night was 28 Feb (-7° Charwelton and 7.5° Preston).

JOAN BLACKWELL 23rd September 1914 to 10th December 2018

Joan was born in Newcastle on Tyne in 1914 and Alfred, her brother (Sonny) 4 years later. The family moved to Worcester where her father, an organ builder, helped install organs in many major cathedrals including Ely and Westminster Abbey. Joan moved to Leicester and worked for a bank where she met Blackie, and then the Imperial Typewriter Company. They married in 1939 and were lucky enough to have identical twins.

They moved to Shrewsbury in the early 1950's where Blackie ran a landscape business with the husband of her old school friend. They then moved to Friern Barnet in 1959 where Joan was offered a job by Margaret Thatcher as her PA, but turned it down as it was too far to travel !!

In 1977 they moved to Newnham where they could enjoy their love of gardening and a village full of lovely people in a thriving community. After Blackie died in 1994 Joan had wonderful support from the village for the rest of her life.

Joan and Sonny kept in close contact and he came to celebrate her 100th birthday in 2014, - he too reached 100. Anyone who heard she was 104 and still living at home would say she's amazing, but her age, independence and sound mind were only a tiny fraction of what made her a wonderful lady.


