THE BISHOP'S LETTER

'Saying Yes to Life' - Lent and Lambeth 2020

This summer, almost 1,000 bishops from all over the world will be gathering in Canterbury for the Lambeth Conference. Some of the bishops, including from our link dioceses in Korea, will be spending a few days beforehand at Launde Abbey with Bishop Donald and myself.

A key theme of the conference will be the global climate emergency that is already impacting the dioceses from which some of the bishops serve. For example, low-lying areas flooded by rising sea-levels and conflict triggered by expanding deserts, forcing people to move and compete for scarce land. Archbishop Justin has recorded a short interview highlighting this aspect of Lambeth 2020. You can view it via www.vimeo.com/359740285.

As we approach the season of Lent I'd like to commend two ways in which we can engage with these important matters from the perspective of our Christian faith: The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book, Saving Yes to Life by Ruth Valerio, is a brilliant exploration of what it means to look after God's world, reflecting on creation themes including light, water, land and seasons alongside environmental concerns. It's full of good stories and great insights. Archbishop Justin says that this book "is perfect for individuals and groups to reflect, pray and be challenged together". Copies are currently available for loan from the Bouverie Court Library. The Church of England's Lent Campaign, '#LiveLent - Care for God's Creation'.

(www.churchofengland.org/livelent) has produced challenges for 40 days in adult and children's versions that are available as a pocket-sized booklet, via an app or by email. The aim is to broaden our view of Christ's redeeming mission. The campaign has distributed over 13.000 sample copies - your church may have some. The daily Bible readings, reflections and suggested actions link with Ruth's book. I think both versions are really inspiring and great fun! If you wish to order copies of these books, contact

In this diocese, we are aiming to make 2020 a year of greater focus on our stewardship of God's earth as the fifth of the Five Marks of Mission – tell the good news of Jesus; teach the faith; tend for all in his name; transform society in line with Kingdom values; **treasure God's creation.** Throughout 2020, look out for new initiatives from the Diocesan Environmental Team.

WEATHER REPORT

First of all many thanks to the 3 contributors, Edgar Mobbs at Newnham, Penny Eves at Preston and

June Pound at Charwelton for their hard work in compiling these figures. They always make interesting reading.

Overall in 2019 the general pattern of weather was much the same in all 3 villages, as one might expect, but as usual Preston Capes was much drier (and slightly warmer) than the other two.

Rainfall. It was a pretty wet year by and large, with Newnham getting 941mm, Charwelton 917 and Preston Capes 680. Edgar notes that Newnham had 203mm more rain than in 2018, well over the running average during the last 25 years of 775mm, and likewise Charwelton was well above its 26-year average of 810mm. The wettest year during those periods was 2012 for both villages - 1136mm in Charwelton.

The first 5 months were extremely dry in both villages (N 221, C 190) but then June and July produced a deluge (N 174, C 195). The last quarter was also very wet - N 376 and C 372. - in both cases the highest last quarter ever recorded in either place.

Temperatures In Preston Capes the mean temperature was 10.1° compared with 10.3° in 2018, while the figures for Charwelton were 9.09° and 9.05° . The mean high in Charwelton was 12.18° and the mean low 5.68° . The hottest day in each village was 25th. July, with 32.0° in Charwelton and 35.6° in Preston, while the coldest night was 31 January, being -4.2° in Preston and -8.0° in Charwelton.

So all in all a pretty mixed bag of weather, which shows little sign of improvement as I write.

PLANNED GIVING

The new year is a good time to review our own 'tithing' or personal level of financial support for our church. Please review your giving and whether it should be raised for inflation, or better personal circumstances. This year our parish share (PS) which we owe to the Diocese whether we have a priest or not, has increased to £11937 per an.

With all running costs of the Church account close to £17000 per annum, it equates to £200 a year for every household here, or £4.0 per house per week, year after year! Please can everyone do their bit to share this and helo ensure we pay PS in full.
