THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

We are in a time of remembrance. We have not only an All Souls service on 5th November for the recently bereaved but the regular Remembrance Sunday commemorations on 12th. Losing loved ones is one of the most sensitive and life changing events we go through. For those accompanying the bereaved it can be a mine field of potential ways we might be insensitive.

For the church, to a certain extent, death is our specialty. Our faith gives us the strength to face this, recognizing there is so much more than this earthly life and grasping the promise Jesus gave us of eternal life, albeit in some form we don't yet grasp. However, the church deals with the grieving in this world, and it does so with gratitude. For myself taking funerals is one of the greatest privileges of ministry.

We certainly want to make the whole thing as gentle and easy as possible. In this regard there are certain things that it is best to know before hand and to clarify if any misconceptions have arisen in terms of practicalities.

No one really wants to think about their own death or the death of a loved one. However, there may be some of you who have thought to yourselves that there is a certain spot in one of the church graveyards that you would like to be buried. I know over several years previously informal conversations may have taken place with lay leaders of the church as to booking a certain spot. Can I just say that there is a legal process for this, and unless you have the documentation from the

Chancellor (legal head) of the diocese this space will not be yours. This may seem overly legalistic however informal conversations may well be long forgotten or indeed the person you had the conversation with may themselves no longer be around when the time comes. I wish this process of reserving a grave space were cheaper too but as with all legal things there are costs involved.

So if you do want a particular spot, not just the next one that comes along, please be in touch with me to get the paperwork. No matter who it was you think you have reserved the space with, if you do not have the legal 'Faculty' (formal name for it) then you have no right to be buried there.

You may see a few post and plaques appearing in our graveyard, these are the reserved plots. Of course, when the graveyard is full it is full, as is the case with Badby and Newnham church yards, and there are alternative graveyards available which the church is not responsible for.

This may seem a gloomy thing to be thinking about but believe me, it is much better to make sure your wishes are known, and that your family do not find at the moment of sharpest grief that they cannot fulfill your wishes.

Directed by Amma Asante (previous film: Belle), starring David Oyelowo & Rosamund Pike (111 mins).




