THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

We have just come through the celebrations of Easter. We are beginning to see all around us the signs of new life and growth in our fields and woods. Yet in our news and across the world we are hit by depressing headlines; the world at war; people we've looked up to for years brought low by secrets being exposed. It is this I want to reflect on in a little more detail.

I am sure I am not alone in being a child of the 70's and 80's who loved programmes like Jim'll Fix It and It's a Knock Out. Even as I type that I feel awkward given what we know of the abuses that were taking place. We read of well beloved church leaders, who had a dark side.

This seems to taint the good that we might know about them. How am I supposed to feel about enjoying those TV programmes? There are campaigns to clear people's names, especially those who died before victims came forward. These campaigns often start by citing all the good works of the person concerned, and bring forward those who simply couldn't believe that they were capable of what they are accused of. Reading between the lines it always seems to say that if one aspect of their personality is true the other cannot be. If they perpetrated abuse then somehow the good works are no longer good. In reverse if they were so good, generous, loving, humble, then they could not have also been manipulative, secret and abusive. This is extremely dangerous, and indeed why many people can get away with

abuse because the victim will not be believed against the weight of the reputation of the abuser.

As a Christian I believe, in fact I know, that both can be true. None of us is all good or all bad, in very crude terms. Jesus' own life brought to light the best in people and in his death brought out the worst. It is his resurrection that leads us through to a new understanding; not a sudden rush to forgiveness but a new life showing the scars

of the worst of the world transformed. We need to hear and believe the victims, but we should not let that negate all other aspects of who someone was. It is a much harder path to walk to recognise the harm and bad in someone and integrate that into the whole

of their life. So yes, I enjoyed Jim'll Fix It and yes, he was a manipulative and abusive man. We will reach maturity when we can hold both as true and learn never to let it happen again.

Pray for all whose abuse has not been believed because of the status of their abuser, listen and believe, and let us all learn to see the best and the worst of all of us may be capable of. Then we can nurture the good and protect against the bad.

David very sadly died on 19th February. There were over a hundred family and friends at his funeral at Banbury Crematorium on March 8th. He had lived in Adstone, Woodford Halse or Little Preston all his life and worked as a carpenter and latterly as a driver for Challis's at Badby. David had suffered ill health over the last three years and finally a major operation at Papworth Hospital was to be in vain. He had been a close part of the Little Preston community for over 35 years and was still mowing the green last summer. He had mown the rear churchyard at Preston Capes for over 15 years before 'retiring' in 2009 and was formerly a member of the PCC. He was a regular bell ringer in his prime. He was badly struck when his wife of twenty years, Queenie, died in 2004 for she had been a marvellous wife but David was an equally marvellous husband, always supporting her, and running the garden and very productive vegetable plot. They were both the most regular of church go-ers too. We give thanks he is now at peace and reunited with Queenie, for both of them were much loved here.
