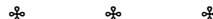

The Listed Places Of Worship Roof Repair Fund has made a grant of £59,500 towards the cost of repairing the church roof which is now estimated to be about £100,000. Together with the funds already raised this is enough to enable us to start work on the repairs as soon as we get the necessary statutory permissions. However we still need to continue with fund raising to

reach the £100,000 target. We are pleased that Fawsley Hall Hotel is arranging a Charity Ball on 30th September to help us reach this total. You will arrive at 7pm for a welcome drink.
