



## THE RECTOR'S LETTER

### Dear friends,

Given recent tragic events in our national life in many respects it's hard to be upbeat. As a country we have lost an MP to a murder with political and social overtones. A family has lost a loving mother and society has lost a person who only ever sought the best for everyone. Jo Cox MP should inspire us all. She is not necessarily someone any of us in the normal course of events may have ever met. Her murder may make our world seem an even more threatening place. Yet her life, her values, her principles and her character should encourage us that there are more people in our country who believe in bettering people's lives and are prepared to put themselves forward to stretch out and make it happen. How many of us have good ideas and good intentions and yet never quite act on them? Whatever the evil intentions of her murderer we have seen a much greater out pouring of the good in people in response to her death.

credibility to any who promote hatred and fear. We will always be balancing freedom of speech and expression with safety security.

As a church I believe we need to make sure that we are not discouraged from speaking truth in our own language too. So here I will state that the hate speakers in our society may have the right to say what they do but they should not. Groups such as Britain First are evil and sinful organizations. Secular society may not have a language to condemn them but the language of the church, one of love peace and justice does. The views they give are evil, they exploit and manipulate the vulnerable into thinking that they are on their side. They are not. They are on the side of evil. Jo Cox has sadly become a martyr of our time. As such I honour her and pray for her family. She is numbered among to great.

May she Rest in Peace and Rise in Glory.

We should make sure we treasure and protect our public servants in whatever role they take. Our open democracy needs to focus on preserving the good and not giving


### BADBY & FAWNSLEY WI.

As many parishioners are aware a large branch from a beech tree has fallen in the churchyard giving much cause for concern. To answer the many questions and queries raised as a consequence the following should help to clarify the position.

The church building and all contained therein is the property of the church. The churchyard, the boundary walls, gates and trees are the property of the church. The graves and memorials are the property and responsibility of the families of the deceased. The Rector, the elected Churchwardens, and the elected PCC (Parochial Church Council) are collectively responsible for the church and the land on which it sits.

Following the formal closure of the churchyard (no more room for burials) responsibility for the maintenance and upkeep has been passed to the Parish Council. After seeking professional advice the tree was deemed to be diseased and the Parish Council has taken action to have it removed.

It does not go un-noticed that everyone else smartens up their gardens too, for this annual 'village opening', and it gives a splendid impression of the village as a whole, such that all can be very proud. Thank you everyone as well.

### ADRIAN STANFORD – OBITUARY

Adrian Stanford lived in the Old Rectory before the Bridgemans. He died peacefully at home in London after a long illness on 3rd May 2016. He was 80 years old. He was a churchwarden here for many years until 1983, a founding Trustee of our Educational Charity, and was buried here on 6<sup>th</sup> June. After National Service with the Sherwood Foresters, when he was for a time stationed in Libya, he studied Law at Merton College Oxford. Subsequently, he had a successful career in the City as a merchant banker. He remained with Samuel Montagu throughout and was the bank's longest serving director. He was known for his attention to detail, his knack of asking probing questions and his considerable analytical powers.

He was appointed Company Secretary seven years after joining the firm, a job he held for twelve years. Subsequently he rose to become Chairman of the Credit Committee and head of Credit and Risk Management. He was also Chairman of the Trustees of the Samuel Montagu Pension Fund.

After retiring he was the treasurer of the Georgian Group for many years and was also closely involved with the Royal Fine Art Commission. His lifelong interest in architecture and historic houses was complemented by his love of gardening.

He will be remembered by all who knew him for his charm, courtesy, and infectious sense of humour, and was much admired here for his pastoral attention whilst a churchwarden. He was always a welcome guest, a good friend and a wise counsellor. Probably unknown to him, he was also regarded as a mentor to many who worked with him.

His lifelong partner was Lord St. John of Fawsley, the former Cabinet Minister and past master of Emmanuel College.


