THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

I am sure it cannot have escaped your notice that we are about to have a general election and a new parliament. The first thing I want to emphasize is the importance of actually voting. It doesn't matter that you may feel that the outcome is certain and your vote will make no difference on way or another, I urge you to vote. The biggest enemy this country faces comes from within and that is apathy.

Each party is putting forward its policies and costings and comprehensively having a go at the other parties. The idea that anyone may act because of a moral ideology seems to have become an anathema. Each party argues for sensible economics, rather than principles. There seems to be very little vision being offered, little offering of a view of the world and how each party would like it to be.

Into this ideological vacuum our Archbishops, +Welby and +Sentamu, have written a letter to all parishes of this country offering guidance for Christians as to some of the underlying principles which should guide our decision making. So I thought I would offer a few of the points that they make as guidance to either agree with or oppose. The following are portions from their letter:

practical level that could mean putting on a hustings event for candidates, volunteering for a candidate, or simply making sure to vote on Thursday 8th June. The Christian virtues of love, trust and hope should guide and judge our actions, as well as the actions and policies of all those who are seeking election to the House of Commons and to lead our country

Our Christian heritage, our current choices and our obligations to future generations and to God's world will all play a shaping role. If our shared British values are to carry the weight of where we now stand and the challenges ahead of us, they must have at their core, cohesion, courage and stability.

These deep virtues and practices - love, trust and hope, cohesion, courage and stability - are not the preserve of any one political party or world view, but go to the heart of who we are as a country in all of its diversity. An election campaign, a Parliament and a Government that hold to these virtues give us a firm foundation on which to live well together, for the common good.

ROGATIONTIDE

Rogationtide (the season of asking for God's blessings on the crops) was marked this year by two events.

On Saturday 20th. May, as was announced in the Badby section of the May Link, a rogation walk took place from Badby to Charwelton, via Fawsley, and back. This was a reminder, in a small way, of the full scale Rogation Walks which we used to hold, visiting all the churches of the 5 parishes, and which in turn harked back to the old tradition of "beating the bounds". This year's version was a most enjoyable event, even though only 9 people took part, and made the more so by the kind provision of refreshments at Charwelton before the return journey. All those taking part felt that it would be worth repeating next year, perhaps with more publicity and on a larger scale.

Then the following day on Sunday 21st. May there was a splendid Rogation themed Choral Evensong at Canons Ashby. This was one of the series of such evensongs with the Fiori Musicali choir providing delightful music. The preacher at this service was

the Ven. John Duncan, Archdeacon Emeritus of Birmingham, who is remembered very fondly by many of us from his frequent visits to our parishes during the last interregnum.

John gave, as always, a most stimulating sermon, leavened with his usual dry humour; and the singing of the 70+ congregation in full voice was splendid.

Maybe these two events might stimulate consideration of similar markings of Rogationtide for next year.
