THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends.

The world can seem a very confusing place. Just watching the News can seem very intimidating. There are all sorts of global concerns which feel far from our control or influence. Yet even closer to home there can encroach on our lives situations that are very frightening and confusing to us very directly. There are some things which affect us, our family and friends which no amount of education, money or power can protect us against. I am thinking especially

of the effects of aging, and dementia. This is something which comes into the lives of anyone, no matter what class, culture, faith or any other social differentiation. It creeps into our families, and means that we only gradually begin to realize that someone we love or indeed

ourselves are now living with dementia and things will not be the same again.

There are however some very good resources and organizations which can help us come to a better understanding of dementia and indeed focus their approach not to seeing it as a desperate diagnosis but rather in developing ways to live well with dementia. As far as possible I believe it can be possible to live well with dementia and would personally like to help us all learn a bit more about this very important subject. I know there will be many people in our villages who are already experiencing dementia in their families and friends. There will be those who feel very isolated and alone facing this. I have therefore been in touch with an organization that can come and shed some light on what dementia is and how we might be able to support those living with it.

This is not a Church Event! This is open to everyone and anyone who wants to come along. This is offered for you, no strings attached, no faith required.

I have invited Bright Shadow to come to lead a Dementia Awareness session on the 27th May. This will be a day event to which you

can attend all or just part of it. They will lead us through awareness and being a Dementia Friend as well as look at creative ways to support people with Dementia. I really hope as many as possible will come along. I have yet to confirm a venue but

PLEASE if you are interested let me know as soon as possible so I can judge numbers and book somewhere appropriate. Please feel free to mention it to anyone you think might be interested, whether they live in our villages or not.

I have been to a session led by this organization and I can heartily recommend their approach as one filled with hope in what can seem a verv desperate situation.
