THE REVD. MICHAEL PETTIT

Those of you who remember our previous Rector Michael Pettit, will have been saddened to hear the announcement recently of his taking early retirement on health grounds. He has sent me an update on his condition and has asked that we include a message in this edition of the Link.

Michael has spent the last few years as Vicar of St. Mary's, Ilkeston, Derbyshire, a town centre church in the market place. He has however not been well for some time, and after much intensive investigation he has been found to be suffering from haemochromatosis. This is a genetic condition in which excessive amounts of iron are taken up (usually simply from the diet) which the body cannot then get rid of. This excess iron is then deposited in various organs, especially the liver and heart, where if it is not dealt with can cause serious damage. [For further details see me later, or look it up on the internet!]. The only way to get rid of this iron is to undergo regular blood letting, which is what Michael has been doing. As of the beginning of April he had been deprived of 15 pints (rather more than an armful as Tony Hancock would have put it)!

All this became to say the least rather tedious and so Michael decided to take early retirement - though,

being nearly 65, not all that early by many peoples' standards. As a result, he took his last service at Ilkeston on 2nd. April, and he and Stella have now moved to a new home in the area. They are at present incommunicado since BT, with its customary efficiency, have not yet got round to providing their new development with even land line telephones, much less an internet connection. He says he will let us know their details as and when BT gets its act together.

In the meantime he would like to reassure all his friends in the Knightley Benefice that he and Stella are starting to enjoy retirement and the chance to see more of their grandchildren. They both send their greetings and best wishes to one and all.

And we of course return those greetings and we shall be keeping them both in our prayers.

MICHAEL JONES 1931-2017 RIP

Michael Jones was a remarkable man. Having built up his parents' pawn-broking shop into a successful jewellery business (one that stands in pride of place in the centre of Northampton), he came to the conclusion that his worldly success was at odds with his Christian principles, and, to resolve things, he gave away his business to his workers. He and his wife Anne lived in a row of houses in Northampton, and shared their home with many young people who were without a place to live. Michael was also involved in setting up Daily Bread – a co-operative in Northampton that provides work for mentally handicapped or disabled people and those rehabilitating into society, who often find it difficult to get and hold on to a job. And in amongst all this, Michael found time to become a regular lay preacher at Preston Capes, guiding, inspiring and nurturing the

congregation here for 7 years, filling the church with his wisdom and Christian belief. Michael was a man who really lived his faith. One of his favourite quotes perhaps encapsulates him best - "there was a man, some thought him mad, the more he gave, the more he had."
