THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

I have really needed this holiday. I seem to have re-ignited my ability to trample on a few sacred cows recently. Ever have those moments when you think "did I say that out loud?". Don't get me wrong; I have meant what I said I just haven't applied the filter of worrying if it will upset someone even if I think it should.

I remember before I was ordained it felt that I was able to speak much more truth than I now feel able. Once in a PCC meeting at the church I worshiped at when at university there was a fierce debate about whether tea and coffee should be served at the back of church in winter instead of everyone having to go outside in the cold and round the back to the church hall. It centred on whether the tea urn was ugly or not! I just burst out with something like "I don't remember Jesus getting upset about the aesthetics of the cutlery at the last supper!" Afterwards others thanked me for saying what they were thinking. Do you know what? It would be nice if occasionally others would say it before me. Actually because I voiced these things was one of the reasons people thought I should be ordained. I know this is going to get me into trouble, but I am trying to rediscover my voice to speak, not what is acceptable or respectable, but what needs saying. I think we all, Christian or otherwise, could do with more truth speech focused on the less powerful and not ourselves. Not on our respectability, or our appearance, or even our self preservation, but trying to let the divine/truth speak through us which risks people's anger towards us. So if I do or say something which for you seems to make you react by threats to walk away because I have overstepped your particular sacred cow, well I am sorry you are

upset but if we all try to mollify everyone we end up saying and doing nothing. We all wrestle with change, we all have lines we draw. As a priest I am called to challenge, admonish. If I were to say I am supposed to call sinners to repentance, who do you think I should be speaking to? Mostly Jesus called to repentance those with power and authority in the world and the leaders of the synagogues (CHURCHES?) Jesus himself upset people. If he had not he would not have been crucified. It is a very powerful form of control of other people's behaviour to appeal to them not to hurt you. I know myself it is a means by which I avoid self examination and reflection. There is a train of psychological thought which says that what most annoys you in other people is the thing in yourself; you. Our need to attend to... Change is not a choice; it is naturally and inevitably happening all the time. The only thing we can have control over is our reaction to it. Not engaging with the creativity of God which produces change is to die. We stand still, and God's work in the Holy Spirit will pass us by and leave us behind.

Daily my sacred cow of believing every single person is created in the image of God is challenged. I know I am called to love everybody, and, just as I can do nothing to deserve the love of God myself, I remind myself - and I remind you - that we don't have to like others or agree with them to love them in the love of God. So I love my parishioners, members of my congregations, with a fierce love enflamed with the Holy Spirit. I cannot help it. I am going to continue to try to allow God to work through me. Bear with me please..

DICK PUXTY

It was with great sadness that we learned of the recent death of Dick Puxty at the age of 94. Although born in Friem Barnet Dick had been a resident of the village for almost all his long life. He served in the Royal Navy during WW2 mostly serving in the Far East, and frequently recounted the horror of his visit to Hiroshima shortly after the atomic bomb. He returned to Charwelton after the war to live with his parents at Sunnybank, working initially on the railway and later for John Batchelor and other farmers in the area. Throughout his time in the village he was been a stalwart of the church, serving for many years as a churchwarden and always being ready and eager to set his hand to any work needing to be done. He was also a fount of knowledge about the life and times of the village and villagers. He will be greatly missed.

CHURCHYARD PLAN

Following some lengthy discussions over the best way of defining the position of reserved grave spaces, Chris and Judy Jones have over the last few weeks been accurately plotting on a scale map the exact positions of all the know graves in the churchyard, and then devising a grid system to make identification easier. That is a long overdue task which has taken them many hours of work and we offer them our grateful thanks.

The next task is to identify each one of those graves. Another working party comprising Graham and Penny C, Meryl, Norman, Chris, and David has started work on cleaning away moss etc. from the older stones, and where possible deciphering and recording the details of names, dates and epitaphs revealed. We are also very grateful to them for their efforts. The details revealed are being recorded on a spread sheet which will also include other information gleaned from the burial, baptism and marriage registers, all of which go back to about 1650. This work has revealed all sorts of fascinating information (the oldest gravestone revealed so far is dated 1662) which will be of great value to historians and to those trying to research their family backgrounds.

All the information will eventually be transferred to a searchable CD and will be available for purchase, alongside the existing CDs of the Baptism, Marriage and Burial registers.
