THE BISHOP'S LETTER

Summer reading

A few years ago I found myself walking down the ruined main street of an ancient Roman city in Turkey, being overwhelmed by the realisation that some of the first Christians in the world would have paced those same pavements and stopped to talk at those same street corners. At that moment the New Testament came alive afresh for me as I imagined those early followers of Jesus living and meeting there. It was rather like the similar feeling many people encounter when they visit Galilee and think about Jesus himself walking on this hillside or standing on that beach.



In particular, as I walked along my Roman road, I wondered how those Church members would have reacted and what they might have said to each other on those pavements when they received a new letter from the apostle Paul.

Phoebe (a new book by the leading New Testament scholar Paula Gooder) seeks to answer that very question. It's an imaginative historical reconstruction of the life of Phoebe whom Paul asked to deliver his letter to the Church in Rome, and who is mentioned in the final greetings (*Romans 16.1-2*).

I found *Phoebe* absolutely fascinating. There is a good (fictional) story line and lots of incidental detail that brings to life the day-to-day experience of our earliest Christian sisters and brothers. One reviewer said "we are there amid the sights, sounds and smells of Rome, sharing in the characters' lives and emotions". Another called it "theology with a heartbeat". It's an easy and compelling read, I didn't want to put it down until I had reached the end of the story! Then there are optional explanatory notes which help to understand some of the finer details.

Paula Gooder, who gave the keynote addresses at our Ministers' Conference a few years ago, describes her passion in this way: "to communicate the best of biblical scholarship to an audience that would otherwise not read it", and she seeks to "bring the Bible alive again for Christians for whom it has become over-familiar, stale or just plain confusing".

If you're looking for some great holiday reading, I can highly recommend it.

MORNING WORSHIP ON AUGUST 26


If you like Evening Service of the Word, our quiet contemplative Service, why not join us for our Morning Worship at 11am? This quiet lay-led

OBITUARY

Ronald Edward Street, 1927 – 2018.

Many villagers are very saddened by the death of a much loved friend and long standing resident. Ron died on the 21st April and, a bachelor, had lived at Old Stone Cottage for many years after his mother died here in 1976. Her sister Jessie Needle had owned Village Farm.

Born in York to Albert Street and Dorothy (nee Payne). Ron had a younger brother Robert born 1929. (The Payne family had lived in Forge Cottage here, where Dorothy had been born). Subsequently the Streets moved to Mytchett, Surrey. As a boy Ron was always fascinated by motor bikes and cars and keen to further his love for all things mechanical. Ron (and Robert) worked at the Weybridge Aircraft works that had been built on the former Brooklands circuit nearby. In the 1950s his mother (who was a nursing sister) and Ron moved to Bristol) where he continued working in mechanical engineering, only to return to Preston Capes with his mother in 1959 and to Old Stone Cottage where, of course, he lived until he died. He worked latterly at the engineering firm Blackwood Hodge in Northampton and amongst his many tasks was engineering for the pirate ship, Radio Caroline. He retired from work in 1998 aged 71, taking up photography and flying model aircraft. He loved the radio (and music in his car) and refused a TV.

A private person Ron was always friendly and spoke to many friends on his daily walk to his faithful silver Renault Laguna by the church which he drove to his favourite Davenport lunch spots, latterly the cafeteria at Danetre Hospital.

He is very much missed in this community and we extend sympathy to his brother Robert and nephew Barry in their great loss.


