Your Community, Your Choice



The Your Community, Your Choice initiative is being partly funded by the money recovered through the Proceeds of Crime Act, using cash seized from criminals with the rest coming from the Police Commissioner. It awards grants to charities and community groups to run projects to help reduce crime. This year North Wales Deaf Associations has applied for funding to provide crime prevention workshops to British Sign Language users.

Project Outline:

The proposal is to run five workshops in three locations across North Wales which will be designed to be easily accessible to people with hearing loss and will cover crime prevention topics. These topics have been identified as areas of need from feedback we have received whilst working in the community. They are:

- Safety in the home
- Anti-social behaviour
- Scams and cold callers
- Domestic violence
- Hate crimes
- Using the internet and social media safely

We intend filming the workshops so that we can post information on our website and social media outlets to ensure the information reaches as many people as possible.

We will also make these BSL (British Sign language) videos available on a DVD for people who are unable to access the internet and will supported by BSL interpreters to ensure easy access to those people whose first language is BSL.

The decision on which groups receives the grant depends on how many votes they receive from the public.

Green Paper: Our Health, Our Health Service

We are seeking your views on how we can improve quality and governance in the NHS

This Green Paper:

- sets out current systems which support quality and governance in the NHS in Wales
 - seeks views on what else we can do to improve, including the possible use of legislation.

The consultation provides an opportunity to consider and discuss:

- the legislation that may be required to help further improve the quality of healthcare services in Wales
- revisit the current organisational and governance structures, following the last major health reforms of 2009.

The paper informs the public debate on a number of current issues such as:

- the role of Healthcare Inspectorate Wales
 - leadership in the Welsh NHS
 - the role of patient feedback

New Campaign to Quit Smoking

19 October 2015 New resources to support North Wales smokers

A new campaign called "Quit for them" which encourages parents to quit for the sake of their children has been launched across North Wales. "Quit for them" is an online resource where smokers can order quit kits, access a comprehensive guide to local services and download vouchers that can be redeemed at local pharmacies for Nicotine replacement therapy and support.

The *Quit for them* campaign is being promoted on facebook throughout North Wales and all smokers are being encouraged to like the page so that they can receive support and advice around quitting smoking.

Delyth Jones is a Principal in Public Health in North Wales and leads on the project, "Many parents will be using the change in the law around smoking in cars and the launch of Stoptober as a trigger to make a quit attempt. The *Quit for them* website, (<u>www.quit.wales</u>) facebook page (<u>www.facebook.com/quitforthem</u>) and downloadable resources will ensure that smokers can access the right support to make their quit as successful as possible."

"We are keen to feature success stories and are looking for parents who have already quit giving advice and encouragement to others. We know how difficult it is to kick the habit and are keen to reward those that have managed to give up. We will be offering those that take part by giving them a pamper session and a chance to take part in a photo shoot during the Autumn."

Judy Henley, from Community Pharmacy Wales said, "Community pharmacies are close to the communities they look after and most are open long hours making them convenient places for people to access smoking cessation support. Our pharmacists are trained to advise smokers about the most appropriate nicotine replacement therapies and give 12 weeks of confidential behavioural support to ensure smokers have the best chance possible of quitting successfully."

Welsh Eye Care Services

In Wales patients who are hard of hearing or deaf are entitled to a free extended (more detailed) eye examination, funded by the Welsh Government through an initiative called the Welsh Eye Care Service (WECS). This gives opticians more time to spend with patients and to help with communication, and also ensure that any eye disease or deterioration is picked up and treated early, as sight loss can be much more devastating for people who have hearing loss. WECS also offer the Welsh Low Vision Service to people with multiple sensory impairments. This assessment is provided free of charge in community optometry practices and a wide range of magnification and electronic aids can be dispensed to patients, again free of charge.

*A visit to an optometrist is free if:

- You're 16 or under
- You're a full time student aged 16,17 or 18
- You're over 65
- You're on certain benefits (Income Support, Income related Employment and Support Allowance, Tax Credit, Income Based Jobseekers Allowance)
- If you are on a low income, you may be able to get help with the cost of sight tests, glasses and contact lenses through the NHS Low Income Scheme. For more information about the Low Income Scheme please visit: <u>http://www.healthcosts.wales.nhs.uk/home</u>

* If you reside in Wales and have a GP in Wales, most optometrists can also offer a free eye test if:

- You have an eye problem that needs urgent attention
- You have sight in one eye only
- You have a hearing impairment and are profoundly deaf
- You suffer from retinitis pigmentosa
- You are of Black or Asian ethnicity
- You are at risk of eye disease because you are the genetic father, mother, sibling or child of someone with an eye disease that can be inherited, such as Glaucoma, Diabetes Mellitus, Age related Macular Degeneration or Retinitis Pigmentosa
- Your have seen your GP and they want you to see an optometrist

Emergencies or if you have an eye problem that needs urgent attention

If you have any concerns at all about your eyes, see a High Street optometrist (also known as an optician) straightaway. He or she will tell you if you are eligible for a free eye health examination. This examination is known as Eye Health Examination Wales (EHEW). Some eye diseases can lead to blindness or some loss of vision, but if detected early enough, your eyesight can often be saved.

An Eye Health Examination Wales (EHEW) is just that – an examination of the health of your eyes. The optometrist will carefully examine your eyes to see if anything is wrong. The tests and equipment they use will depend on what you tell them and what they find. An eye health examination is more in-depth than and different to a routine vision test, so it may take longer.

If the optometrist decides you need an eye health examination, it won't cost you anything.

You can find an optometrist in most High Streets in Wales. If you have a sight problem, you can go to your existing optometrist (if you have one) or just phone or walk into any practice that is convenient for you to get to.
