Information from Public Health Wales

Public Health Wales is calling on people in Wales to help tackle the growing problem of childhood obesity.

The 10 Steps to a Healthy Weight is designed to support professionals and help families across Wales to help prevent childhood obesity.

Currently 1 in 4 children in Wales are overweight or obese when they start school, which means they are more likely to be overweight as a teenager and as an adult.


This also brings with it a number of health problems like asthma, low self-esteem and diabetes.

Public Health Wales has launched 10 Steps to a Healthy Weight which outlines the key factors that increase the likelihood of a child being a healthy weight when they start school.

The advice focuses on three age ranges – pre conception and pregnancy, 0-2 years and 2-5 years.



'Mr Bulkeley o'r Brynddu' gives us a vivid picture of life and the weather in 18th century Wales. The production consists of excerpts from his diaries in William Bulkeley's own words – in English. The context of the linking Welsh dramatic pieces is easily understood. Songs and music of the period mentioned in the diaries are an integral part of the production. Perfect for Welsh learners.
