#### WARD BOUNDARY UPDATES

Councillor Kenneth Harrington would also like to take the opportunity to advise members that at the forthcoming Borough elections (May 2015), the Redwell east ward will no longer exist. Instead there will be the new 'Hatton Ward' formed that will include Hatton Park Road, part of Hardwick Road, Harrowden Road, Whytewell Road, part of the High Street, The Pyghtle, part of Gold Street, and the Roads leading off, such as George Street, Park Road, The Avenue etc. The rest of the old Redwell East, will become part of the new Redwell Ward, which will also include what is now Redwell west. Mr Harrington feels a great affinity with the area and as such has chosen to stand for election in the Hatton Ward and if elected would like to continue with his full support of HPRA.

Malcolm Waters has chosen to stand in the new Redwell ward with Councillor Mark Hollyman, who has a business at the bottom end of Debdale, will also be standing for the Hatton Ward.

Alan Warwick will not be standing at the election this year but we thank him for all of his support with our association over the years.
