We continue to serve the community with good links with our schools, Rowantree and Cragie High, and Mid-Lin Day Care Centre. We have been involved in giving 'chaplains input' in school assemblies in both schools and RME slots and Bible Readings at Literacy Day in Rowantree.

We hold a monthly service at Mid-Lin which is well attended and appreciated by the folk there.

Stay and Play continue to provide wonderful support to families in the local area and this year have had lots of activities around health and wellbeing. They have had an outdoors focus, including a flower arranging session led by Vina that was really enjoyed by parents.

The 19th Dundee Girls Brigade continues to thrive and this year the girls have explored topics such as: the body; moral choices; being safe; eco-issues. These topics always have a spiritual dimension too and we have had many external visitors to help us with our topics: The Teddy Bear Hospital; the Fire Brigade; the Gate Church Eco Project. The whole company enjoyed the annual retreat to Glenesk and they have also led us beautifully in worship at our Ash Wednesday and Christingle Services.

The Youth Group has met every other week and support each other to grow in faith and walk with Jesus. Activities this year included a trip to Glenesk and a number went to Teen Ranch.

In the lead up to the General Election we hosted Hustings in the Church, giving the local community the chance to question those standing for office.

We were happy to be able to take Roxanne, a ministry student on placement from September 2018 to Easter 2019. This went very well and Bishop Andrew felt St. Ninian's would be a good place to train a curate and so Roxanne joined us as a transitional Deacon at the end of September. It is a joy for us to be able to raise up young leaders, and we pray for Roxanne as we walk alongside her in her formation.

As we get ready to bring 2019 to a close, let us pray that we can continue to be God's building of living stones that will stand in this place for many years to come, bringing the Good News of God's love to the people we meet every day.
