R.N.L.I Wotton-under-Edge Branch

On February 28th Captain John Harper, Master of the RRS Ernest Shackleton, a British Antarctic Survey(BAS) supply ship, entertained 84 residents of the Wotton-under-Edge area to an informative and entertaining story of the work of the BAS and his yearly trip to the continent to deliver scientists and supplies to the bases. The talk was held at the Cotswold Edge Golf Club for the Wotton-under-Edge Branch of the RNLI and raised the fantastic total of £1013.00. Subject to the agreement of the Branch committee and to the RNLI receiving planning permission, this money will be put towards the proposed funding of a new lifeboat station at Portishead, near Bristol - this following an approach from the independent Portishead Lifeboat Trust seeking "adoption" by the RNLI. Adoption has been agreed in principle subject to a suitable site being established for a lifeboat station and planning permission has been submitted for this on the site of the old Portishead Masonic Lodge. Once established, Portishead will then be the nearest RNLI station to those living in the Wotton-under-Edge and Dursley areas.

Wotton Arts Festival

Wotton Arts Associations preparations are well in hand for this year's Festival which will take place on 20th April and 25th April to 5th May.

To kick off the Festival St George's Day will be celebrated at the Town Hall with a dragon workshop for children, Mummers, folk music, and coffee and cakes. Wotton Silver Band will give a concert in St Mary's Church in the evening. The Band will also perform the final event of the Festival on Wotton Hill on May Day morning.

In between these two traditional celebrations will be a variety of events to appeal to all. The Festival Art Exhibition in the Civic Centre will give local artists an opportunity to display their work. The Lea Singers choir from Harpenden will perform a choral concert Haydn's Nelson Mass and the Duruflé Requiem, with organ accompaniment on the first Saturday and also sing at the Festival Service in St Mary's the following morning.

The varied programme includes a talk on medieval paintings in Gloucestershire, a French film to mark 100 years of cinema in Wotton, a poetry evening, "Turning the Tables" with local celebrities Ali Vowles and Rob Collins talking to Philip Taubenheim about their choice of music, and an evening of folk music with Dead Dog Cider. The Bristol Ensemble will give the Festival Concert with Erin White, a local violinist studying at the Royal College of Music, as a guest artist. Tickets are on sale at the Cotswold Book Room.

Kingswood Parish Council

Annual Parish Meeting - This will be on Monday 8th April at the Village Hall. 7pm to look at the information and from 7.30 for the formal part of the meeting. This meeting is not a parish council meeting but a meeting of the community. We have tried to make it as interesting and informative as possible. There will be a presentation from the Police on Community Speed Watch. This is a scheme which could make a real difference to the speeding through our village. Please come along and find out more and how you can sign up and volunteer to help get this scheme going. There will also be a presentation from the Gloucestershire County Archaeologist on the archaeology found so far at the Chestnut Park site. This should be very interesting and informative and a chance to ask questions on archaeology as part of the planning process. There will also be reports from many of the village organisations and the parish council will have available the accounts for the year 2012/13 and the budget and objectives for the year 2013/14. The Dog Warden, Neighbourhood Warden, County and District Councillors will all be available on the night for you to raise questions or have a discussion on any burning issue that you may have.

Parish Council Budget - By now you would have received your Council Tax Bill. The part of the bill relating to parish council has increased by less than 10p a week for band D households. More details of this can be found on the parish council web site. The parish council remain committed to ensuring that Kingswood is maintained to the high standard that you all expect.

Playing Field – Over the next few weeks there will be work taking place at the playing field. The parish council has commissioned a drainage survey to ascertain if a solution can be found to the drainage problems. Disruption to use will be kept to a minimum.

Church Yard – The much used footpath through the churchyard has deteriorated and is in need of repair. The Parish Council has joined with County Council and the footpath should be repaired in the next few weeks. Apologies for any disruption to use, but I am sure it will be much improved after the essential repairs

Dog Fouling- Once again we are receiving complaints for dog fouling on the Ash Path. Over a hundred piles have been identified. Please can all dog walkers act responsibly and pick up after their dog. If you know who is causing this offence please let either a councillor or the clerk know. They can then take action. **The dog Warden** will be at the Annual Parish Meeting to discuss this on-going problem.

The Annual Spring Clean – This will take place on Saturday 13th April from the Chipping. Litter pickers, bin bags and Hi-Vis vests will be available for from 10.00am. Please can everyone look to the kerbs, hedges and pavements and remove as much rubbish as possible. Please also pay attention to weeds and leaves blocking drains. It is hoped we can get as much of the village looking clean and tidy ready for the spring as possible. Just turn up on the day or getting going when you are able. Please let the Clerk know if you need any equipment and she will deliver it to you.

Village Design Statement - Please Please help with this important survey. Contact the Clerk if you need any help or advice. It is hoped that more copies of the survey will be delivered with this newsletter. It is becoming more important than ever that the community gets involved in the Village Design Statement and Neighbourhood Planning. New Planning Legislation means that without this the developers have a strong say in the amount, location and type of development. However the parish council believe that it is important for the community to have an input to all of the above and this can be achieved by ensuring that there is a Village Design Statement and a Neighbourhood Plan for Kingswood.
