If so, the study will provide an estimate of the cost of construction of the route to enable a future funding programme. Message from Alex Myrie, Dog Warden - With the darker nights comes an increase in the amount of dog fouling we see in our amenity areas and the pavements in general. We strongly believe that the vast majority of dog walkers are extremely responsible and carry out their statutory duty by removing their dog's faeces and disposing of the bag appropriately. However, there appears to be a staunch minority that clearly feel it is beneath them to pick up poo, or that they are above the law and who habitually fail to clean up after their animals. These individuals need to know that Officers are regularly patrolling in the area at various times of the day and night. Therefore, our message to the irresponsible few is this... PICK UP OR PAY UP! This is not an idle threat, anyone caught will not be given a second chance and an on the spot fine of £75 will be issued. Bagged dog waste can be disposed of in any litterbin, dog waste bin or taken home, double bagged and placed in your household waste. Anyone caught littering their bag will also be issued with a £75 fine. Anyone who would like to report an irresponsible dog owner can do so, in confidence, by contacting either of us on the numbers below. Unfortunately, just reporting fouled areas leaves us with very few options. What we really need is for the residents of Kingswood to be our eyes and ears, take pride in the beautiful area you live in and assist us by reporting those individuals who are letting the side down. Lisa Ellis, Neighbourhood Warden Litter - The playing field and the area in front of Tyndale View is looking very messy with lots of litter on the ground. Automated Number Plate Recognition Camera (ANPR) - We are very pleased to confirm that 2 new ANPR cameras will be installed in 3 locations in Kingswood. This is a joint initiative between the Parish Council and the Police. The Police have taken on extra staff to help with this project and the parish council have provided the cameras. Work on installing the cameras will take place from the end of March. The cameras will provide a lot of statistics that will be shared with the Police who will use the information to enforce the speed limits. More information will be made available as the project goes live towards the end of April. Information will be on display at the Annual Parish Meeting. **Parish Council meetings-** The parish council meet on the 2nd Monday of every month. A meeting is held on the 4th Monday of the month if there is business which cannot wait until the 2nd Monday of following month.
