Proposed crest Nicholson Development - The parish council have reviewed the Crest Nicholson proposed 65 houses development for Chestnut Park. The council have considered the details and listened to the views of the community and considered that this development would bring more harm than benefit to the community. The parish council will consider the planning application when it is received and will update the community on this issue.

Village Design Statement - Wild Life Survey – Please can you help identify what wildlife there is in Kingswood? This information will form part of the environmental detail in the design statement.

On a recent visit to the village Gloucestershire Wild Trust were pleased to find a colony of Sparrows and Starlings in the Squaws Lake, Hillesley Road area. They were nesting in the gardens adjacent to Squaws Lake. Both of these species are in decline. It is important to note the different types of species to enable us to help influence the landscape to ensure their survival. Please email the clerk with details of wildlife in your garden or the surrounding countryside or put details in the survey box attached to the back of the notice board.

Youth Activities - The parish council has arranged two days of youth activities to be held on the playing field on Friday 11th and Thursday 17th April. This will be held from 10.00am until 4.00pm at the playing field. This is a free session available to all young people from the ages of 11 to 18 years of age. KINGSWOOD NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Notes from the last meeting of the Police and Community Panel, where reps from Wotton and surrounding villages discussed policing in the area.

Crime continues to be low, still reducing in most categories, Kingswood having about one incident per month, though Wotton has more anti-social behaviour than Cam and Dursley. A surprise or not? You may have noticed the drop in reports of theft from the Taylor Wimpey site and its consequent spill over attempts into the village. The police think that they have the thieves. Vehicle fuel tanks are regularly dipped for "red" diesel, stolen from such sites. The stats for the speed cameras around KLB are refreshingly law abiding! The police were impressed with the efforts of Kingswood volunteers with the speed gun and have tried to get volunteers from the other communities.

The lay panel, i.e. us, votes on police priorities in the area. It retained the existing ones (Anti social behaviour, parking, speeding A.S.B. in vehicles). The police spend a lot of time in schools to get the message across. They see a good response. In the light of recent tragedies they will add car driving issues for the older ones,
