Christmas is a time for giving and sharing and the New Year a time for resolving to do something new! This year why not combine the two by signing up to Fair Shares? Fair Shares is a community based charity that uses two-way volunteering to reward people for the time and effort they put in to their neighbourhood. It enables members to swap their time and skills with other members of the Time Bank. There is no money involved as the only cost is your time. The first Time Bank in the country was set up in Stonehouse and it now covers Stroud, Dursley and the surrounding parishes. When someone joins they provide details of the skills, talents and experiences that they would like to share. This is kept confidentially at the Time Bank. When a participant needs help they call the Time Bank which then matches the right person with the right skills and arranges for it all to happen. For every hour of help the person providing the skill gives they receive one Fair Share time credit. That person can then use the credits to spend on things that they might need help with. The sorts of things participants do is endless:- They give lifts; do shopping; gardening or housework; they visit elderly people; do craft work; one lady collects buttons and stamps and makes them into packs which are to be sold in Fair Shares' charity shop. The Charity shop, which is next to the Co-Op in High Street, Stonehouse also needs clothes, bric a brac etc. So if you're having a clear out especially after Christmas let me know and I will deliver it there. Even if you are housebound you could give your time by phoning someone who needs tuition or is lonely. We all have something to offer, equally we all have needs. Highways - A big thank you to all those who responded to the Wickwar Road Traffic calming consultation. As a result of your feedback the proposed traffic calming will go ahead. I will keep you up to date on the time scales but this will be in the New Year.

As a result of this consultation lots of people commented on other roads with issues. The Parish Council are taking up the issues with the Highways Department and the Police to see if anything further can be done.

There are some things we can do to help ourselves with the problems of Highway Safety and in particular pedestrian safety. Firstly I am told most speeding is committed by local people so be aware of your speed and observe the limits in the village. Please park sensibly to ensure that you are not obscuring the view. This is a particular problem on the Hillesley Road/ Wickwar Road junction and the Hillesley Road / Walk Mill Lane junction. Please can all householders on the Wickwar Road please check that their hedge is cut back to the boundary line and that there is enough space for 2 people to walk side by side on the footway without being pushed into the road.

Weather - Sand bags - We are coming into the season of weather related problems. Currently flooding is an issue. I hold a stock of empty bags for use as sand bags. Soils of Walk Mill Lane have stocks of sand. I also have a small quantity of the gel filled bags. Please let me know if you require any supplies and if at risk of flooding please keep a supply at the ready. Grit – The parish council has a supply of grit for use on the highway and pavements only. Stocks are held at The Chipping and Nind Lane. Please let me know if further supplies are required at these locations or elsewhere in the village.

Volunteers - The Parish Council would like to thank all its volunteers for all the time and efforts that they put in on our behalf. Thus includes the Water Wardens, Snow Warden, Footpath Warden, Play Equipment checkers and the Flower bed maintenance. Your help is much appreciated.

Village Design Statement - The completion of the design statement does depend on the involvement of as many people as possible in the village. Please can you help by taking some time to complete the survey form. These can be obtained from the Clerk or downloaded. Please take the time to help as this is an important opportunity to have a say in the future of Kingswood.
