Crest Nicholson Application - Thanks to everyone who has commented or helped to gather evidence for the comment on this application. It has been a great team effort with everyone working for the benefit of the village. The end is in sight! Stroud District Council will make a decision on this application on the 18th December 2014 at the Development Control Meeting at Ebley Mill. This is a public meeting and there will be opportunities for objectors and supporters to make their comments to the committee members who will be taking the decision. This meeting usually takes place in the evening but as there are so many applications, the timings will be extended. As soon as we have confirmation of the time, I will publicise the details. The easiest way to keep in touch on this is to be on the Parish Council's email database. Please forward me your email address for inclusion. Notification of the times will also be made via the KKaV membership and on posters. Kingswood Parish Council (KPC) will be meeting on the 8th December at 7.15pm at the village hall to discuss the final details on the comments to be put forward. There will be a public session to take further comments. Winter Weather Preparations - Please can everyone keep an eye on drains and report any which are overflowing. The drain on Chestnut Park is still awaiting repair and we are pushing hard for this to happen. It is important that we ensure that drains are kept clear of leaves and rubbish. Please can you keep a record of any flooding events or drains over-flowing. It is important we have the evidence to support our call for action on these matters. Dates and times are good, even better if you can take a photograph and send to the Clerk. The parish council has a supply of grit and will ensure that the grit bins are filled. This grit is to be used on the public highway and pavements and not on private drives! There is also a supply of sandbags; however, these are the outers and will need to be filled with sand. Please contact the Clerk if you would like a supply.

Wild Life Areas Community Orchard and Allotments - These areas are still not in parish council ownership. However, we are chasing the legal transfer. Meanwhile the council is working with Stroud Valleys Project on a grant proposal to get funding to take over the wild life areas and for the community to manage them. More details to follow on this, but we will be looking for volunteers to help. Highways issues - Community Speedwatch is still active and we are working with the Police on trying to deter vehicles from speeding in Kingswood. Thank you to the Speed Watch Volunteers for all their efforts on this. Parking in the village is becoming an increasing problem we need to ensure that cars are parked safely, not causing an obstruction or blocking the pavement. There is a particular problem in the following locations; Hillesley Road, Chestnut Park and Rectory Road. This is especially important with the dark nights that vehicles are not forcing pedestrians on to the roads. The Police will be monitoring the parking in Kingswood and will be issuing advice to any vehicle owners they believe are causing an obstruction.

Community Facilities - The parish council and the Village Hall Management Committee are undertaking a review of the facilities at the playing field and village hall. This is to ensure that the current level of facilities is sufficient for our current and future needs. A survey will be carried out asking for your views. Please respond, as it is important we know what the community wants to enable us to take any projects forward.

## **WOTTON UNDER EDGE POLICE COMMUNITY TEAM**

The latest Policing priorities for the area have now been set. These will remain for the duration of the next six months before going under review. They are as follows –

- To reduce anti-social behaviour in and around the areas of Wotton-under-Edge, North Nibley and Kingswood.
- 2. To address community concerns of speeding, parking and the anti-social use of motor vehicles. This will also include promoting the education of safe driving for young drivers.

**How do I contact the Police?** - Please report all incidents of anti-social behaviour and concerns via the police 101 non-emergency number. You can also use the e-mail 101@gloucestershire.police.uk For all emergencies please call 999.

Wotton under Edge - Kingswood - North Nibley. Crime reduction advice. Please feel free to make contact with the policing team by e-mailing Benjamin.rollins@gloucestershire.police.uk for crime reduction advice. We will be more than happy to come and give a home visit. There has been an increase during the months of October - Start of November in attempts of thefts and thefts from garden sheds as well as garages within the areas. There has also been one recorded burglary. Please be aware that the clocks have been adjusted therefore creating the extra hour of darkness. Wotton under edge - Thefts of number plates from vehicles. - During the evening of Friday the 31st of October it has become apparent that there had been a spate of number plates removed from vehicles parked around the streets of Wotton under Edge. Of all these thefts, only one person had reported the incident. The number plate for that vehicle was later found and returned to the owner. I encourage all members of the community to report such behaviour as it enables us to establish local trends and patterns within the community. Again by calling 101 or e-mailing the 101 system. All incidents will be dealt with as necessary.

Suspicious persons – Door to Door Sales. - I encourage you all to report any suspicious door-to-door sales. Recently within the areas, we have had various incidents of attempts at sales of 'spare garden benches' to 'spare bedroom furniture.' These could be legitimate sales but could equally not be. These persons could be looking at your property layout. Please ensure that you do not let anyone onto your property without the correct Identification. You have a right to say no. If you are able, please take clothing descriptions, person descriptions as well as vehicle details if seen and then forward these details to our team.
