### KINGSWOOD PARISH COUNCIL

**S.11/1839/ful - 27 Houses at Chestnut Park** - Permission was given to the building of the houses subject to conditions and the agreement of Taylor Wimpey in paying £10,000 to the village. This is subject to legal agreement and is currently being drawn up. Until this has been completed the full implications of the development remain unclear. If Taylor Wimpey do not agree with the conditions the application returns to the Development Control Committee on 13th December. Taylor Wimpey has not yet withdrawn the appeal.

The Parish Council discussed the decision in a meeting on Monday and took into account the views of the public in attendance. Members of the public and some Councillors expressed concerns with the process and procedures, applied during this application. The Parish Council does not wish to incur any further expense to either Stroud or the Parish but will take advice on the possibility of a Judicial Review. The Parish Council will also bring a complaint through the SDC complaints procedure, the Local Government Ombudsman and also our MP Geoffrey Clifton Brown.

The Parish Council would like to thank all those who commented on this application. The comments helped to bring about improvements to what was originally put forward by the Developer.

**Stroud District Consultation on Dog Fouling** - Stroud District Council is holding a consultation on Dog Fouling. The specific control orders the Council believes would enhance the district relate to:

- Failing to remove dog faeces
   Not keeping a dog on a lead
- Not putting, and keeping, a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer
- Permitting a dog to enter land from which dogs are excluded.
