Nearly 100 Senior Citizens enjoyed a slap up New Year's Eve lunch in Kingswood Village Hall. A record number attended the event, which has been held every year since 2000. Greeted with Sherry or Prosecco, the guests were treated to a turkey lunch with all the trimmings with unlimited wine plus dessert and Ria Kendall's chocolate truffles, finishing with cheeses and Port. During the meal, they were entertained with songs by Kingswood Playgroup and the rich voice of Paul Clark, who generously waived his fee. All this was free to the guests, the costs being borne by the Association with generous donations from Waitrose (Chipping Sodbury) green token scheme, Accolade Wines and Kingswood Post Office. The event would not have been possible without the services of Leyhill Prison's kitchen staff, Kingswood W.I. and many helpers. With splendid prizes, funded by Renishaw, the lunch finished with a raffle, whose £353 went to the Playgroup. A photographer attended, providing memories for the guests.

All this rounded off another successful year for K.V.A., whose role is the provision of fun events in the village: Show Day, Come Dine With Me, Open Gardens, Comedy Night and a Christmas Wine Festival. The £5,500 profits from these provide not just the New Year's Eve Lunch, but donations to village causes. Farewell Yellow, Hello Red & White! - Recent Changes to UK Helicopter Search & Rescue

The Wotton-under-Edge Branch of the RNLI is holding another fund-raising Guest Speaker evening at the Cotswold Edge Golf Club. This year's speaker is Captain Thomas "Sticky" Bunn. Previously an RAF pilot flying Sea King SAR (search and rescue) helicopters from RAF Valley on Anglesey, Captain Bunn now works for Bristow Helicopters, flying helicopters out of Caernarfon Airfield as part of the team providing the civilian SAR helicopter service for the UK on behalf of HM Coastguard.

Captain Bunn's illustrated talk will cover both his experiences at RAF Valley on Anglesey (flying the yellow RAF Sea King) over the coasts and mountainous areas of North Wales and the change to flying the Sikorsky S92 (in the red and white HM Coastguard colours); following the MOD's decision to no longer provide the civilian airborne SAR role. Captain Bunn was brought up in North Nibley and went to Katharine Lady Berkeley School. The talk will be held at the Cotswold Edge Golf Club on **Wednesday 22nd February**, starting at 8:00pm. Allotments - We are currently working towards making the allotment site ready for use. Please contact the clerk to confirm that you still want an allotment or register your interest in an allotment. Allotment Meetings will be held with interested parties to take this forward. Wild about Kingswood – Volunteers are needed to help with this project. Please contact the clerk if you are interested. Help is also needed in designing the information boards and in planting hedges, wild flowers and bulbs in the area to make it attractive to wildlife and also the community. A picnic bench and seat has been placed in the community area next to the shed and a bench on the verge at Tyndale view. Richard from Stroud Valleys project is at the Chestnut Park site every Wednesday from 10.30am. Please go along, say hello, and if you have time join in and learn how to manage the land.

Local Council Tax and Budgets - The Parish Council has set the amount of Local council tax to for Kingswood in the year 2017/18 at £86,900. Based on a house in band D this is an increase of £1.18 per month. This equates to an annual increase of £14.27 which is a 9.31% increase on 2016/17. Councillors are finalising the budget in the February meeting and full details of the budget will be available shortly after the parish council meeting on Monday 13th February 2017.

Car Parking at Squaws Lake - This area is owned by the parish council. Please ensure that any cars parked here are fully taxed, insured, and legal to be used on the highways. It is not an area for cars to be parked up and mechanical works undertaken.
