About the course: Come along, enjoy and learn the art of scything, the traditional way of making hay with Fred Miller, Stroud Valleys Project Officer. The course, designed for the beginner, will give people an introduction to the use of the Austrian style scythe, its use, sharpening and maintenance. If you sign up to the course you will not only be learning a new skill but helping to manage the site for the Great Crested Newt population and other wildlife, that live or use the local nature reserve. The course is open to 12 attendees, a reserve list being drawn up.

The Hall already caters for Playgroup, Lace Making, Toddlers, Womens Institute, Karate, Zumba, Brownies, Jubilee Club, Slimming World, Yoga and Parish Council meetings, There are regular bookings for the Blood Transfusion service, for use as a polling station, it accommodates annual events like Heaven of the South Cycling, rated amongst the best of its kind in the country. Bristol Churches hold an annual get-together. The National Trust have recently used the Hall for a regional conference and fully appreciated the facilities. Youth and adult sports organisations use our changing rooms and shower facilities on a regular basis. We now have a stage and sound system rated to professional theatre standards and we have bookings and further interest from many local amateur dramatics groups. The Hall is fully licensed for music and there is a well-stocked bar and a dance floor in the main hall that was recently

refurbished.
