Their challenge was to learn a new song and perform it to their family and friends in the barbershop style at the end of the day. Jo Dean our Musical Director, set about teaching some simple warm up and crafting routines which included exercise of the body and voice, designed to enhance good breathing and posture to enable the best possible sound. The groups were taught a well known song 'One Fine Day' by the Carpenters in four part harmony together with the FR chorus. Dividing the groups into 4 parts was a task in itself, but manageable by our astute musical director. Once divided, they were sent away together with a team leader and chorus members into separate areas to learn their particular harmony part.

Later in the day, visitors were also taught how to enhance their facial expression and movement to portray the song into a performance and perform they did! It was amazing to watch the transformation and confidence of the groups grow during the day. The day concluded in performance to family and friends. This was a day to remember with more than 100 singers giving a show that would make any family member proud. Well done to all who attended.
