The parish Council has been aware of the concerns in connection with the lorries and contractor vehicles on Chestnut Park and Rectory Road. After a meeting between Taylor Wimpey the Parish Council and the Police I believe matters have now been resolved. There should be no reversing on Rectory Road or Chestnut Park. The Contractor has put up signs to say no contractor parking on Rectory Road and Chestnut Park. Lorries will not be allowed to wait for access on Rectory Road but will have to wait in the lorry lay-by at Tortworth before they enter the village.
