Annual Parish Meeting- Thank you to everyone who attended I hope you found it an informative meeting. The Annual parish meeting is a meeting of the community so any ideas on how to improve the format for next year and suggestions for presentations are welcomed. Grant Awarding Policy - The parish council has reviewed its grant awarding policy. This is in line with comments from you that were made during the Parish Plan Consultation. The parish council wish to ensure that there is an open and fair process in applying for grant funding. The parish council invites applications for grant funding from village organisations.
