Annual Parish Meeting. It is a legal requirement that this meeting is held annually. It is not a parish council meeting but a meeting of the community. This year the meeting will take place on Monday 19th May 2014. The doors will be open at 7pm to enable you to view the information available. The formal part of the meeting will start at 7.30. The following people will be in attendance at this meeting. Phil Skill, Head of Planning at Stroud District Council. Phil Skill will be discussing the recent changes in planning laws and how they affect villages like Kingswood. He will also be covering how Neighbourhood Plans can help. Some of Kingswood's young people will talk about the recent youth events held at Easter on the playing field. Gloucester Wild Life Trust (GWT) will discuss the importance of local wild life and how we can help to protect it. The Police, Neighbourhood Warden, Village Agent, Dog Warden, a representative from Gloucestershire Rural Community Council and both the District and County Councillors will be in attendance and able to answer your questions. There will be reports from village organisations and a report from the parish council. Village Design Statement- Thank you to all who sent wild life details these are most helpful. There will be a display of the draft design statement for you to comment on at the Annual Parish Meeting. Please come along and take the time to view this and comment on it. It is important that we get this right and your views and comments are essential.

Wild Life Species Recognition Session- Gloucestershire Wild Life Trust will be running a species recognition training day on Tuesday May 6th at 6.30 starting at the playing field. The purpose of this session is to help us identify birds, insect, wild life and plants that we have in Kingswood. The session will cover how to identify and record the information. This session will be free to anyone who wishes to attend. It will be helpful to have numbers of those who wish to attend to ensure that we have enough equipment.
