#### Let's Talk

Depression is the leading cause of disability worldwide and is becoming more common. Depression, anxiety and stress are also the leading cause of sickness absence in the UK, with 70 million working days lost each year. The World Health Organisation chose depression as the topic for World Health Day on April 7<sup>th</sup>, in recognition of the growing situation, the need to speak more openly and as a way of highlighting the support available.

In Gloucestershire, Let's Talk is a free NHS service for anyone aged 18 and above to seek support and advice.

Evidence shows that if you seek support early, you can recover more effectively and more quickly, and avoid further problems developing.

Let's Talk provides a range of options, from advice over the telephone and educational courses to self-help guides and face-to-face Cognitive Behavioural Therapy.
