There are two reasons for the ongoing need to fundraise. First, there are some maintenance costs – for example the Village Hall's defib recently needed a new battery pack, at a cost of £238. Second more defibs are needed - two areas of Kingswood would benefit from having locally positioned 24/7 defibs.

In Wotton we have recently raised enough funds for 9 extra defibs (with 3 more in the pipeline). I am sure Kingswoodians are at least as generous as Wottonians, what can be achieved in Wotton we can more than match.

The three 24/7 defibs in Kingswood are located at:

i. The shop: behind the pillar-box.

ii. The village hall: on the outside wall, adjacent to the main entrance door.

iii. The Primary School, Abbey St: on the front wall, next to the main entrance.

Defibrillators are used to help resuscitate patients suffering a sudden cardiac arrest.

The main symptoms displayed by a patient in sudden cardiac arrest are:

1) the patient is unconscious (not responding) and

2) the patient is not breathing (or not breathing normally e.g. gasping).

• Remember: you cannot harm the patient by using the defib. You can only do good.

Wild about Kingswood – Richard from Stroud Valleys Project is at the Chestnut Park site every Monday from 11.00am. Please go along and say hello and if you have time please join in and help to manage the land. The parish council has received reports of littering in the ponds. This has damaged the breeding site. If you have any information on this please let the Clerk know.

Local Plan Review - Stroud District Council is carrying out a review of the Local Plan for the period 2020-2040. SDC will be carrying out road shows and meetings to explain the review. The Exhibition is on Monday 26th November at Kingswood Village Hall (2.30pm onward). There will also be a public meeting on 26th November at 7pm also at the Village hall. Mark Russell the Planning Strategy Officer will present the Local Plan review and how it affects Kingswood. There is a proposal within the review for 2 housing allocations sites within Kingswood. It is Important that members of the community engage with the review and let both SDC and the parish council know their views on this and other questions raised. Automatic Number Plate Recognition cameras (ANPR) - The council is pleased to observe that there has been a decrease in the excessive speeding recorded by the cameras. The Police will now be looking at the persistent offenders who may not be driving at high speeds but are regularly speeding through the village.

Please observe the speed limit when driving through Kingswood, and elsewhere. The Police will visit and take action on vehicle owners who persist in exceeding the speed limit through the village.

Thank you to all of you who have commented on the cameras via the Kingswood Notice Board or on the parish council Facebook Page. The council has noted your comments and will be consulting all residents of the parish on highways concerns and on what solutions could be implemented.

Playing field - The parish council has installed a new rubbish bin on the far side of the playing field. Can all users please ensure they use the bins provided or take their litter home. Thank you to all the members of the community who help to pick up litter at the playing field. The parish council will be carrying out a consultation with all residents on the playing field and other community facilities. **Tubbs Turf Boundary Wall** - The parish council need to consult with members of the community on the taking out of a Public Works Board Loan (PWBL) to pay for the repair to the boundary wall at Tubbs Turf. A newsletter from the council will be delivered to every household in the parish. Full details of the repair and the details relating to the PWBL can be found on the Kingswood Parish Council website. A survey has been set up via Survey Monkey asking if you support the loan or not. Postal responses can also be sent to the parish council.
