Bowel Cancer Awareness

It's an embarrassing subject to talk about, but Bowel Cancer is one of the biggest killers especially in the over 55s. Around 34,000 people are diagnosed in the UK every year, 30,000 of which are 55 and over. Whilst around 13,000 people die from the disease every year, only 9% of patients are diagnosed at the earliest stage. If caught early, over 93% survive for at least 5 years compared with only 7% of those diagnosed at an advanced stage. It is essential therefore that an early diagnosis is made. So if you have any of the following symptoms you should seek advice from your GP immediately:

- Blood in your faeces
- Looser faeces for 3 weeks or more

If you haven't got these symptoms but you know of a family member or friend who is complaining of them, you could be a life saver. Use your closeness to them to talk to them about the problem, help them overcome the embarrassment, encourage them to see a doctor, offer to go to the appointment with them and be there after the consultation. Don't forget doctors and nurses are professionals who have heard it all before so they won't be embarrassed. A government campaign to highlight bowel cancer is taking place until the end of September but it doesn't end there. If you have any worries yourself or about a family member or friend, seek help and advice from your GP. There are also briefing sheets available which I can obtain for you or you could speak to one of our specialist Village Agents who are trained supporting people with issues relating to cancer.

BUS PASSES. Over the next 6 months, some of you will be getting a letter from Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) about how to renew your bus pass. This might be because you are eligible for an "age related pass", or a "disability related pass". GCC have taken over this job from the local district councils so, as you can imagine, they have a very large number of people they need to contact and so are staggering it across the 6 months. If your pass is due for renewal, don't worry about contacting them; you will get a letter over the next few months. If you're applying for the first time, the initial pack may seem a little overwhelming to start with but actually once you discard the information that is not relevant to your specific circumstances, it's all fairly straightforward. Call me if you need any help and I'll see what I can do.

BLUE BADGE. Similarly the new process for applying for or renewing a Blue Badge can be off- putting when you first go through the pack but again, I am happy to help if I can.
