Crest Nicholson Planning Application for Chestnut Park - There are two applications, one for outlying planning permission for up to 59 houses and one for the creation of a vehicular access. The applications can be viewed on the Stroud District Council web site at www.stroud.gov.uk the ref is S.14/1927/out and S.14/1928/ful. Please take the time to view the application and make comments. The planning Officer needs to have received all comments by the **10th October**. The Parish Council met on the 8th September and has formally voted to object to both applications. The parish council has appointed consultants to help with putting forward the objections. However, we need evidence to back up our claims. Please send me any pictures of flooding or Highway problems at Chestnut Park, Rectory Road and Wickwar Road. Thank you to everyone who helped with the traffic survey on Rectory Road. The results will be available soon and will be helpful evidence. The Parish Council will meet again on the 6th October at 7.15 at the Village Hall to consider the full details of its objection. Members of the public are welcome to attend and take part in the public questions section of the meeting.

So make sure you write a letter(s) for each application. In addition, a massive thank you for the many volunteers who made the traffic survey a complete success with a fully comprehensive set of data - this is being analysed and when available the results will be shared.
