Pardon, What Did You Say?

Did you know that one in six of the population have some form of hearing loss and from a total of 3.7 million, two thirds of those are over retirement age? Predictably, more than 70% of over 70 year olds have some form of hearing loss and yet even those who have a hearing aid often use them infrequently. Severe hearing loss which requires daily support can be a criteria to receive Attendance Allowance or DLA Disability Living allowance. I was surprised to learn that in order to get the best use from your hearing aid, YOU SHOULD USE IT ALL THE TIME (yes, I AM shouting!), that means putting it in as soon as you get up and leaving it in until you take it out to clean it and to go to bed. The reason being, the auditory processing of sound takes time to adjust and using the aid as much as possible helps the brain make that adjustment.

bright and beautiful" helped popularise his idea of harvest festival and spread the annual custom of decorating churches with home-
grown produce for the service. The produce that is used to decorate the chapel will be donated to the Dursley Food Bank.
