# Planning - Crest Nicholson - 51 houses at Chestnut Park

The applicant withdrew this application ahead of a decision by the Stroud District Development Control Committee. The first application for 59 houses is scheduled to be heard by the Planning Inspector at a 4-day public enquiry starting on **December 8<sup>th</sup> 2015**. Full details of the appeal can be found on the Parish Council web site.

**Gladman - 90 houses at Charfield Road** – Comments should be made to Planning at Stroud District Council and the reference is S.15/1271/out, which can be viewed at <u>www.stroud.gov.uk</u>. We understand that the applicant is seeking a decision on this application in August however the planning officer has indicated it will not go before the development control committee before October. Due to this, the applicant may decide to take this application straight to appeal. **Wickwar road** – We have no further information on this application, only that the applicant wants a decision before Christmas but Stroud District Council has not yet received the application.

**Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)** – Sections of the NDP will be available to view on Showday. It is hoped that the final NDP will be ready for consultation September/October.

**Community Heart Defibrillator** – The parish council together with KVA have purchased a community heart defibrillator, which will be publicly available and located on wall of the gym on the Chipping. This equipment will be easy to use, as it will talk you through what to do. However, we will run some training sessions so that everyone who wishes is able to find out more about how to operate the equipment. Details to follow. It is hoped that this equipment will be in place end of September/ October.

**Charfield Road Bus Stop** - Damaged earlier in the year, repairs and a refurbishment will be taking place in September. **Dog Fouling** – Please can all dog owners pick up after their dog. If you see any owner not picking up after their dog, please pass the information to a councillor or the clerk who will take up this matter.
