Public Convenience- The parish council will be carrying out maintenance works to the toilets and apologises for any inconvenience that this work may cause. The works include new doors, gate, window frame, toilet seats and a cleaning of the rendering and painting of all woodwork.

Improved disabled access at the playing field and Village hall – The parish council will be re-siting one of the barriers adjacent to the village hall. This will improve the access to disabled users and parents with buggies. The re-siting of the barrier will mean that there is direct access on level ground to the village hall.
